



The 'Supporting Medication Management in Residential Aged Care' initiative (under the Improving Access to Primary Care and Other Health Services' Budget Measure) is intended to address the Government's response to the following Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety recommendations:

- Recommendation 68: Universal adoption by the aged care sector of digital technology and My Health Record
- Recommendation 66: Improving the transition between residential aged care and hospital care.



Problem



Increase the use of digital systems in the Aged Care Sector which improve patient safety and promote the quality use of medicines; addressing widespread issues associated with poor medication management and the safe and effective transfer of residential aged care residents between clinical care settings.

Program outcomes

The Program aims to support older Australians receiving better connected aged and heath care, enabled by My Health Record (MHR) and supported by a digitally enabled and proficient aged and health care sector.

Our deliverables



- Residential aged care facility (RACF) will have the ability to generate an electronic aged care transfer summary (ACTS) which will be supported by a current medicines list and advanced care plan (if available in MHR)
- RACFs will be supported to register for MHR
- Industry Offer to incentivise software vendors (who support RACFs) to upgrade their solutions to enable the ACTS capability in their systems and connectivity to MHR
- Standardise the technical requirements and information requirements (minimum data set) for aged care clinical information systems
- Digital health literacy uplift of the aged care workforce (to support the outcomes of the Program) is under consideration.








Worker Screening Overview



- The National registration scheme for personal care workers
 - Is an election commitment
 - Consistent with recommendation 77 of the Royal Commission
 - Has four elements.
- Commencement is staggered
 - The Code starts on 1 December 2022
 - Worker screening commences from 1 July 2024
- Expands on the existing National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Worker Screening Check
- Will create a register of cleared and excluded workers in the aged care sector
- Will require the development of an ICT solution
 - A product has been developed and will be ready for user testing in the first quarter of 2023





Worker Screening User Research



Purpose:

To better understand the way aged care providers manage their workforce – this will ensure that the solution developed is fit for purpose.

Key Research Focus:

- Understand existing processes within aged care providers for managing different types of workers across their business to support the worker screening design
- Conduct useability testing of the proposed screening interface within the My Aged Care
 Provider Portal to support the future design
- Gather feedback from providers who already participate in the NDIS worker screening process



What's Next?




Update on reforming in-home aged care

A new program will commence 1 July 2024 combing existing in-home aged care programs

Objectives

- improve access to services
- better align services to needs
- reduce administrative costs
- better support independence
- make aged care simpler
- facilitate innovation and investment



Discussion paper


- Released on 18 October 2022
 - Outlines proposed reforms to the in-home aged care system that:
 - Incorporate what we have heard with a focus on five key areas
 - Seeks submissions from the community by 25
 November 2022.

Assessment


- Assessment in home, or hospital
- The assessor and client jointly set an initial support plan, within quarterly budget



- Goods, equipment and assistive technology (including loan scheme)
- Home modifications
- Short term allied health
- Specialised support services

Ongoing supports at home

- Access to extra services for temporary needs
- Client contributions set by capacity to pay
- Regular reports on services & budget

Providers

Short term support for Independence

- Goods, Equipment & Assistive Technology and Home Modifications Scheme
 - Separate funding
 - Loan scheme
 - National procurements
- Grants for specialised support services
- Allied health and restorative care

Mixed funding model for ongoing support

- · Activity based funding
- Supplementary grants as for:
 - Transport, cottage & centre-based respite, meals, social support group
 - Providers who operate in thin or niche markets
- Funding pool for additional client services (set at 25% of client budgets each quarter)
- Client contributions by capacity to pay
- Monthly or more frequent payments with automatic data capture

Self Management issues:

- Clients can have multiple providers who get paid in arrears against the client's quarterly budget
 - How to prevent over booking by clients, leaving no funds available when providers invoice?
- A client may have a care partner who is not separate to their provider(s)
 - How do we providers share information with a care manager in another organisation?

New payment platform no longer a focus

Where we started

- Point of delivery payment platform
- Allow invoicing as services delivered
- Real time data on each client's hours of different services.
- Book and pay functionality

What we heard from Providers

- Not keen on new platform
- Not interested in care workers submitting invoices
- Detailed data is kept in existing systems
- Preference to invoice from existing systems
- Online bookings not feasible given links to scheduling.

What's next

- Department to use & extend existing Health and Services Australia capabilities and integration channels to capture provider booking and service delivery data
- Provide options for batched payment claims (daily, weekly, monthly etc)
- Providers to continue to manage Bookings and Client Contribution payment collection








Goals: Build a proof of concept prototype of the developer portal and test it via co-design



Prior to the Federal Budget October 2022-23 announced on 25 October, the B2G project was scheduled to conclude on 31 December 2022.










2023 Planing ICT Platform Roadmap (4 Year)





Business changes are in place to enable and accelerate the adoption of ICT capabilities by the Aged Care Sector.




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Wrapping up for B2G
