### 1.1 General use items

- 1.1.1 The group general use items (as endorsed by the Clinical Implementation Reference Group as being identified for removal from the Prostheses List) being reference priced to public hospital prices are intended to still receive a reduction of 60 percent of the difference between the Weighted Average Price and the Protheses List benefit from 1 July 2022 (this includes the eight skin glues which will no longer take a price reduction on 1 March 2022), followed by the remaining 40 percent from 1 March 2023 before being removed from the Prostheses List on 1 July 2023 when bundling arrangements are intended to be implemented.
- 1.1.2 Applications for comparable items are not being accepted in the interim, recognising some sponsors do not agree with the policy. The impact on patient access to devices that are not intended to be listed in the interim is to be assessed by the Clinical Implementation Reference Group.


