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

- Improved quality care



What we heard

Make it easy for providers to submit data

- Provide categories for types of non-compliance
- Identify the relevant aged care service
- Allow timeframes for noncompliance
- Confirm who identified non-compliance

Revised data collection approach



Drop-down lists for the type of and reason for non-compliance



Free text enabled to specify non-compliance responsibility/requirement and actions taken



Collect service name and confirm if noncompliance has ceased


