



# COVID-19 outbreaks in Australian residential aged care facilities

# National snapshot

As at 8:00 am 10 August 2023 there are 614 active COVID-19 cases in 106 active outbreaks in residential aged care facilities across Australia. There have been 48 new outbreaks, 7 new resident deaths and 524 combined new resident and staff cases reported since 27 July 2023.


<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Outbreak opening and closure includes changes in the status of exposure sites to outbreaks (and vice versa), which are applied retrospectively to facility records. New case information can also change the status of a recovered site back to an active outbreak site. As a result, changes in active outbreak status may not align with day on day variations to active totals. These adjustments will also affect the number of cases in staff and residents reported each week.



## **Mortality**

For the period of 1 January 2023 to 5 August 2023, COVID-19 is recorded as the cause of death in 3.2 percent of all deaths in permanent residents in aged care facilities.


Since the beginning of the Omicron outbreak in mid December<sup>5</sup> 2021, there have been 97,380 deaths in residential aged care from all causes (report period from 15 December 2021 to 5 August 2023)<sup>6</sup>. COVID-19 deaths account for 5.1 percent of this figure.

Over the course of the pandemic, all-cause excess mortality in Residential Aged Care was below expected numbers in 2020, and within expected range in 2021.

(v) Community deaths are total COVID-19 deaths reported in the NNDSS data less resident deaths.

# Workforce in active residential aged care outbreaks

As at 11 August 2023, workforce surge staff have filled a total of 176,868 shifts in aged care services impacted by COVID-19, including 307 in the past 7 days. In the past 7 days (to 11 August) surge workforce providers have assisted 15 residential aged care homes. These shifts include roles for GPs, nurses, care workers, allied health workers, executive and ancillary staff. This includes:

The Australian Defence Force provided support to a total of 542 residential aged care homes between February and September 2022. The ADF deployment ceased on 30 September 2022.

#### **Oral antiviral treatments**

Distribution of the oral anti-viral Lagevrio (Molnupiravir) commenced on 6 February 2022 to all RACFs with outbreak sites prioritised for delivery. The National Medical Stockpile has deployed 48,269 treatment courses of Lagevrio (Molnupiravir) to aged care facilities.

75,463 prescriptions for Lagevrio (Molnupiravir) have been issued to residents in residential aged care facilities, with a further 6,154 prescriptions for Paxlovid (nirmatrelvir + ritonavir) also issued since 28 February 2022 and up to 6 August 2023.

## **Vaccination in Residential Aged Care Facilities**

People living in residential aged care homes remain a high priority for the Government's COVID-19 vaccination program. The Department is continuing to communicate with both the aged care and primary care sectors, reinforcing the importance of uptake and promoting the 2023 booster dose via regular newsletters, bulletins, social media videos and webinars.

All aged care residents who have not had a COVID-19 vaccination, or a COVID-19 infection within the last 6 months, continue to be offered a 2023 booster dose. The added protection from vaccination is especially important for aged care residents and will help reduce the risk of severe illness or hospitalisation.

The Department continues to work with Primary Health Networks to support residential aged care homes across Australia to arrange COVID-19 vaccination in-reach clinics with local primary care providers such as GPs, community pharmacists, and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services.

# As at 9 August 2023:

- of those aged care residents who have been eligible for a booster dose since January 2023, 98,178 (65.6%) eligible residents have received a 2023 booster dose. This is an additional 2,136 residents since last week.
  - Eligibility for the vaccine under current settings is fluid, with people becoming eligible as they reach 6 months after a COVID-19 infection. This means that aged care residents who are now eligible may have only recently become eligible.
- 97% of residential aged care homes are recording residents vaccinated with the 2023 booster.
- 113,789 (61.6%) residents are estimated to have had a recent immunising event of a vaccine dose (including the 2023 booster), or COVID-19 infection in the last 6 months and are therefore not currently eligible for a 2023 booster dose.

The estimated eligible population is made up of residents who have completed their COVID-19 primary course and had their last COVID-19 vaccine dose or infection more than 6 months ago. As residential aged care populations are fluid, and case overlay is not exact, eligible populations for vaccination are an estimate only.

#### Infection control and audit

People living in residential aged care homes remain a high priority for the Government's COVID-19 vaccination program. The Department is continuing to communicate with both the aged care and primary care sectors, reinforcing the importance of uptake and promoting the 2023 booster dose via regular newsletters, bulletins, social media videos and webinars.

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As at 10 August 2023, the Commission had conducted 5,245 ICM spot checks to observe infection control practices and PPE protocols in residential aged care facilities.
