Purpose: To discuss the work of Hope Assistance Local Tradies (HALT).

Desired Outcomes: To seek an update on HALT's funded activities, and thank Mr Forbes for the

organisation's work.

Key Matters:

- Mr Forbes has requested this meeting to discuss the work of HALT through the Community Health and Hospitals Program (CHHP).
- HALT has submitted an application for the National Suicide Prevention Leadership and Support Program (NSPLSP) grant opportunity. It is expected that Mr Forbes may wish to discuss the NSPLSP application with you or seek support for future funding.
- Mr Forbes may also enquire about the possibility of joining the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) which was established to advise on Head to Health Adult Mental Health Centres.

Discussion Guide:

Stakeholder information:

• HALT was founded in 2013 after the suicide of a local tradesman in the Castlemaine area. HALT aims to build a bridge between local and national support services for people employed in trade occupations, primarily men.

Proposed Objective and/or Desired Outcomes:

• This meeting is an opportunity to seek an update on HALT's activities.

Stakeholder Objective:

- Mr Forbes is expected to seek support for future funding to expand HALT's work. This may include seeking your support for the organisation's NSPLSP application or asking about other funding opportunities.
- It may be worth noting that Suicide Prevention Australia has undertaken some deep engagement with representative organisations for men's mental health and will shortly be releasing key principles to guide co-designing approaches.

Key Points:

NSPLSP

- Mr Forbes has provided you with a copy of HALT's application for the NSPLSP.
- Applications for the NSPLSP closed on 28 January 2022 and are currently being assessed.
 The Department is the delegated decision maker.
- For probity reasons, it is recommended that HALT's application for the NSPLSP not be discussed with Mr Forbes to maintain integrity in the decision-making process.

Head to Health

- Mr Forbes has expressed interest in joining the TAG that was established to advise Government on the design of the Head to Health Adult Mental Health Centres.
- The work of the TAG is now complete and the TAG has ceased.
- The Department will retain Mr Forbes' details should future opportunities arise to be involved in mental health program design and implementation.
- Mr Forbes may also wish to engage with PHNs that have established Head to Health Centres to consider any opportunities for engagement at the local level.

Sensitivities or Contentious Issues:

Nil.

Budget/Financial Implications:

- As part of the *2019-20 Budget*, \$2 million was announced over four years (2019-20 to 2022-23) to support HALT suicide prevention workers through the CHHP.
- Funding supports workers in both the South Eastern Melbourne PHN and North Western Melbourne PHN regions to create awareness of suicide prevention supports for tradies.

Issues:

- 1. Your office has requested a submission to provide funding of \$1.0 million (GST exclusive) over two years (2023-24 and 2024-25) for the extension of the HALT project.
- 2. The project is currently funded through the South Eastern Melbourne PHN and is scheduled to end 30 June 2023.
- 3. On approval of this submission, the Department will work with the South Eastern Melbourne PHN to provide an extension of funding to HALT through a variation to the PHN's Primary Mental Health Care Schedule.
- 4. The funding will continue to support activities within the South Eastern Melbourne PHN and North Western Melbourne PHN regions, including within the Electoral Division of Flinders.
- 5. Upon approving a grant within a Minister's electorate, there is a requirement under paragraph 4.11 of the CPRGs to notify the Minister for Finance. A letter is at Attachment A.

Background:
As part of the 2019-20 Budger, \$2.0 million over four years (2019-20 to 2022-23) was invested under the Community Health and Hospitals Program (CHHP) to support the HALT project.

This funding supports suicide prevention community workers in both the South Eastern Melbourne PHN and North Western Melbourne PHN regions to create awareness of suicide prevention support for tradies.

HALT aims to build a bridge between local and national support services for people employed in trade occupations, primarily men. Funding this initiative via the PHN will ensure effective linkages between HALT and other local service providers.

HALT does not have Australian Government funding beyond June 2023.

Budget/Financial Implications:

The Mental Health Division has confirmed there are sufficient funds available under Priority 013 -Mental Health and Suicide Prevention to cover the proposed \$1 million expenditure.

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Election Commitment Implementation Brief

Extend HALT's funding

Commitment

A Coalition Government will extend funding for the Hope Assistance Local Tradies (HALT) program for a further two years from 1 July 2023. HALT support suicide prevention community workers across Melbourne's south-east and north-west to promote mental health and connect tradies with suicide prevention support.

Stakeholder impact

- This program supports people employed in trade occupations in the South Eastern Melbourne Primary Health Network (PHN) and North Western Melbourne PHN regions.
- The trade occupations targeted by the program are predominantly male.

Implementation

- The Department of Health will work with the South Eastern Melbourne PHN to provide an
 extension of funding to HALT through a variation to the PHN's Primary Mental Health Care
 Schedule.
- Policy authority and funding (available under Priority 013 Mental Health and Suicide Prevention) exists for this program ceasing on 30 June 2025.
- Since 2019–20, HALT has received \$2 million in Australian Government funding, via a single grant under the Community Health and Hospitals Program (CHHP), ending on 30 June 2022.

Next steps

South Eastern Melbourne PHN to enable commencement of the extended funding arrangement in July 2023.

Key Issues:

- Mr Jeremy Forbes, Founder of Hope Assistance Local Tradies (HALT) has written to the Minister to introduce the organisation and to outline the range of supports they provide.
- 2. HALT has received Commonwealth funding of \$2 million over four years (2019-20 to 2022-23) committed under the Commonwealth Health and Hospital Program (CHHP). The funding was provided through their local Primary Health Network (PHN), with funding due to cease 30 June 2023.
- 3. The funding supported engagement of suicide prevention community workers in South East and North Western Melbourne to create awareness about mental health and suicide prevention supports and services available for tradies.
- 4. Funding for the HALT project has been provided through the South Eastern Melbourne PHN for the delivery of the HALT project. A requirement under the funding agreement was for the PHN to work in collaboration with the North Western Melbourne PHN to ensure an equitable implementation of activity across both catchment areas.
- 5. In his correspondence, Mr Forbes refers to an extension of funding for two years through the South Eastern Melbourne PHN. He expresses some concern that this would not cover activity in the North Western Melbourne PHN region.
- 6. Mr Forbes seeks an opportunity to meet with you or your office to discuss a pathway for securing funding to support continued work in North Western Melbourne PHN catchment and potentially other PHNs (refer Attachment A).
- 7. Draft correspondence has been prepared at Attachment B.

Future Funding Decisions:

- **8.** On 5 April 2022 the former Minister for Health approved a commitment of \$1.0 million over two years (2023-24 and 2024-25) to South Eastern Melbourne PHN for the extension of the HALT project.
- **9.** That funding is to be sourced from existing funds available under Priority 13 Mental Health and Suicide Prevention. However, the Department has not progressed the funding commitment at this time.
- **10.** You may wish to reconsider the previous Government's funding commitment given the previous funding is ceasing and HALT was unsuccessful in a competitive funding process.

Background:

The CHHP program was part of the 2018-19 Mid Year Economic and Fiscal Outlook (MYEFO) measure and the 2019-20 Budget.

Under the current funding arrangements, South Eastern Melbourne received the following funding to specifically facilitate services through the HALT program:

- Mr Forbes co-founded Hope Assistance Local Tradies in 2013 in response to a local need for suicide prevention initiatives for people working in trade professions.
- HALT has received Commonwealth funding of \$2 million over four years (2019-20 to 2022-23) via South Eastern Melbourne PHN to support trades people in both the South Eastern Melbourne PHN and North Western Melbourne PHN catchment areas.
- HALT does not currently have Government funding past June 2023.
- The former Minister for Health approved \$1.0 million over two years (2023-24 and 2024-25).
- The Department has not progressed the funding commitment at this time.

On 24 October Minister Butler wrote to Mr Forbes and advised the Government is currently considering funding commitments, and encouraged Mr Forbes to maintain contact with the Department of Health and Aged Care regarding progress.

Mr Forbes co-founded HALT in 2013 in response to the suicide of a local tradie. In 2016 Mr Forbes was awarded the Westpac Social Change Fellowship Award and in 2018 Mr Forbes presented a TED Talk on HALT's work.

MENTAL HEALTH AND SUICIDE PREVENTION GRANTS

KEY POINTS

- The Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Division manages 249 grants with \$1.2 billion in funding in 2022-23.
- There were 5 instances of non-compliance with the Commonwealth Grant Rules and Guidelines (CGRGs) in 2022-23. The total funding associated with these grants is \$34.9 million.
- Non-compliance resulted where the department varied grant agreements before Grant Opportunity Guidelines were approved and published.
- The CGRGs were not complied with to ensure uninterrupted service delivery.
- All grants relate to closed, non-competitive grant rounds, where the Minister had already approved the grant recipient and amount to be provided.
- All grant recipients met the requirements of their previous grant agreements with the department.
- In all instances, Grant Opportunity Guidelines were subsequently approved and published.
- Separately, three instances of non-compliance with the CGRGs for grants relating to previous financial years were reported in the Financial Compliance Management System in December 2022.
- Australian Government presedent of Information Act The department manages 57 procurements with \$39.1 million in funding in 2022-23.
 - This includes 9 consultancy procurements with \$4.3 million in funding in 2022-23.

NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THE CGRGS – GRANTS FOR PREVIOUS YEARS

Three grants were approved and offered to grantees without grant opportunity guidelines being developed or published. This was done on the basis the grants had been approved by the Minister, publicly announced, and having a high expectation that funding would be provided as soon as possible. The Division assessed offering this grant as low risk and there being a greater risk if not progressed quickly.

Any future funding arrangements with these organisations have or will have grant opportunity guidelines developed so no further instances of non-compliance occur.

The 3 grants were announced in the 2019-20 Budget. However, while they were identified and included as a case study in the recent audit of the Community Health and Hospitals Program (CHHP) conducted by the Australia National Audit Office, were not CHHP projects.

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CEASING GRANTS

- Hope Assistance Local Tradies (HALT) received funding through the Community Health and Hospitals Program. Funding ceases 30 June 2023.
- Previous Government made an election commitment to provide \$1 million over two years (2023-24 to 2024-25) to extend HALT.
- HALT has been advised its funding will not be extended. This was a decision of Government.
- The Government funds a range of supports for men, including other programs focused on improving mental health and suicide prevention outcomes in male-dominated industries (e.g. MATES in Construction, OzHelp) under the National Suicide Prevention and Leadership Support Program.
- [If needed] HALT aims to promote awareness of suicide prevention supports for tradies support services for people employed in trade occupations, primarily men.

Key Issues:

- 1. This brief provides an overview of the all funding under Prorgam 1.2 Mental Health as at 10 October 2022.
- 2. Program 1.2 Wental Health currently has 272 active contracts (grants and procurements) with a total value of \$1.1 billion in 2022-23. A list of these contracts, including their purpose, funding details, selection process and advice on if the funding is well targeted and delivering the intended outcome, is at **Attachment A.**
- 3. Contracted Program 1.2 funds have been provided in accordance with the *Commonwealth Grants Rules and Guidelines* or the *Commonwealth Procurement Rules*. Funding opportunities are outlined in Grant Opportunity Guidelines or Approach to Market documentation and published on the GrantConnect and AusTender websites.

Competitive process

4. A competitive funding process involves a merit-based assessment of eligible applications against the nominated selection criteria and other applications. Competitive rounds can be 'open' to the market or 'targeted' to an identified cohort of the market based on specalised requirements or geographical considerations.

- **5.** There are 57 non-Primary Health Networks (PHN) contracts that were subject to a competitive selection process with a total value of \$64.2 million in 2022-23, comprising:
 - a. 43 contracts from ongoing funding which mostly relate to the National Suicide Prevention Leadership Program and the Mental Health Care Minimum Data Set.
 - b. 14 contracts from terminating measures across a broad spectrum of programs.

Non-competitive process

- **6.** A non-competitive 'closed' funding process is where a provider is approached directly based on their past performance or characteristics of the particular market, with their suitability assessed against nominated selection criteria. Non-competitive processes are appropriate where there is a lack of competitive providers in the market based on specialised requirements or geographical considerations. This process has been used by the Department to ensure continuity of specialised services and programs delivered by particular organisations, and where organisations have been identified and selected by Government, for example as part of a Budget process.
- **7.** There are 116 non-PHN contracts selected through a non-competitive process with a total value of \$280.0 million in 2022-23, comprising:
 - a. 22 contracts from ongoing funding which mostly relate to the Program for Assistance to Survivors of Torture and Trauma, and strengthening mental health and suicide prevention data accountability and quanty.
 - b. 88 contracts from terminating measures from a broad spectrum of programs.
 - c. 6 one-off contracts absorbed from existing funding.
- **8.** There are 99 non-competitive contracts with PHMs with a total value of \$764.5 million in 2022-23, comprising:
 - d. 31 contracts from ongoing funding for arimary mental health care.
 - e. 68 contracts from terminating measures which relate to Commowealth psychosocial support, headspace Demand Management and Enhancement Program, bushfire response and one-off projects.

Expiring contracts

9. Of the 272 active contracts, 148 are effectively expiring in 2022-23. Any decisions to continue funding for terminating measures, or to cease ongoing funding arrangements, will need to be made in the context of the 2023-24 Budget process. The Department will provide specific advice on these options, including risks and sensitivities.

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
