The Esther Foundation has been asked to place forward a submission to the Federal Government to support the extensive residential health, development and leadership program that our organisation delivers to young women, young mothers and young children that come into the organisation's care. The request for such funding was suggested by our local Federal Member for Hasluck, Ken Wyatt AM MP.

The community service that is accessed by many women is not Government funded on a day to day basis but has benefited from the State Government purchasing the St Emile's site (a former convent) back in 2010 for \$3.91m for our organisation; and also benefited from a State Lottery Commission grant of \$4m to undertake the construction and renewal of the site.

We need to expand the service further due to the increasing need of support for the restoration of young women coming out from drug use, domestic violence and family breakdown in our community; we are harnessed in doing so somewhat, through the considerable lack of staffing and much of our organisations energies going toward 'rattling the tin' to resource the extensive and award-winning community service that we provide.

If we were able to access \$1m per annum recurrent funding for 3-5 years from the Federal Government, then we would have the immediate prospect of offering the service to up to 100 women, increasing our present capacity which is around 60-70 persons presently.

It would present as funding extra staff and services attending to the ever growing wait- list for the many young women knocking on our door for assistance each year. Specifically, as most of the clients that currently seek our support are young mothers caught in the life destroying methamphetamine cycle and even younger women caught in debilitating behaviours as self- harm, eating disorders and even youth suicidation which are all part of a broader epidemic in communities across Australia and very sad.

Upon your visit to our organisation, you will be given access to hear from some of program participants who have benefitted greatly from the service we provide, which is encouraging as treatment services are very limited across our nation presently. Truth be known, it is the hospitals and mental health units that contact us for help, not the other way around.

One of the key benefits of our program is that our graduates become of part of the reward structure of society and contributing members of our community, as well as getting out of the Federal welfare system. It also means that they have little need for chronic care from an already overflowing hospital system. Both are positives for the Federal Government that will present a return worth saving of tens of millions of dollars over the lifespan of our clients, if they can have access to such a service that can provide them the support provided to get well and stay well. This is what our organisation is all about, by assisting the many young women to both see and realise their true potential.

Such funding will also assist to improve our operations delivered on the ground, so we are guided further with business improvement, further training for staff, site improvements and general resources to extend the programs access by some 30-40%.

Fortunately, our organisations program has been around for two decades with positive results and outcomes for our clients, in the media and in the broader community; so you are not funding any type of new initiative, rather than supporting an initiative that already has all of the results on the board.

As mentioned previously, such access to fund our organisation will alleviate the many financial costs and burdens of running this charity, based on it being self-funded to date by significant 'tin rattling'; whilst also increasing its capacity to assist many more young lives that are suffering from more often than not; life destroying behaviours.

I have attached our latest AGM Report for your perusal, which details what our organisation is all about, and also a profile brief. What you will see is that we do a great deal with the limited money we have each year and could so much more if your office was able to assist us with funding.

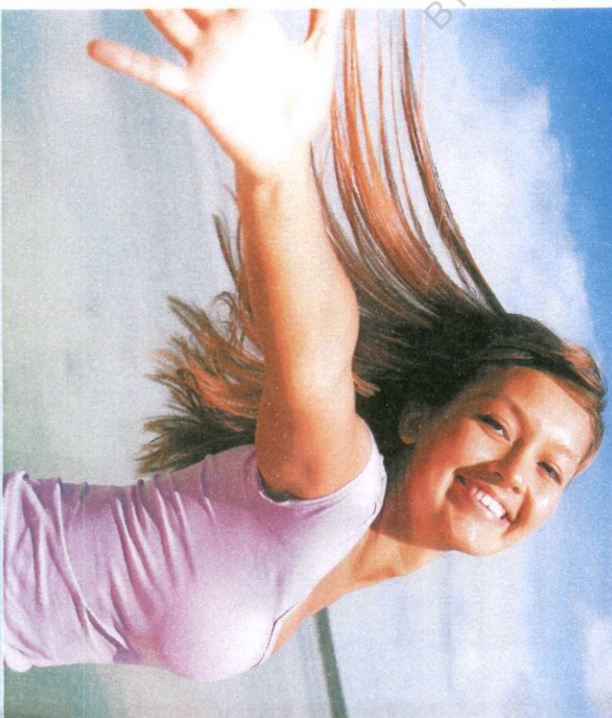

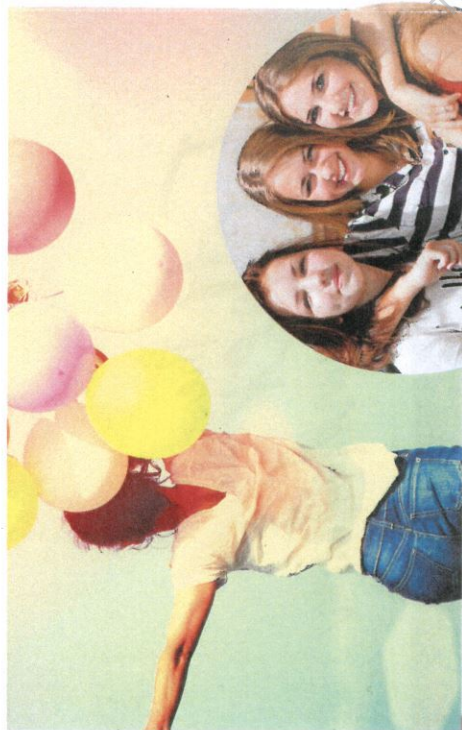

CREATIVE ARTS

An extensive creative arts program runs parallel to the recovery program in an attempt to balance the intensive process of ones journey through recovery with the opportunity to express themselves through different art forms. RECREATION

As part of our program, the Esther Foundation has an association basketball team, volleyball team, a triathlon health and fitness team, aerobics, zumba, swimming twice weekly, physical training and girls are required to walk each morning. In addition to this, two camps are held each year in the South West, there are excursions each week and summer includes many outings to the beach and to the hills for bushwalking and picnics.

EDUCATION

All participants of the Esther Foundation that are nineteen years of age or under must attend full-time education within the program, which is approved by the Curriculum Council of Western Australia. The content of this education facility includes Maths, English, Independent Living, structured Workplace Learning, Beliefs and Values and Recovery in the Community. All other program participants have access to vocational courses, hospitality training and many other accredited courses of study, some delivered within the Esther program on site.

The recovery program within Esther has integrated itself closely with education in order that young women can advance themselves educationally whilst in a residential program working on their individual recovery issues.

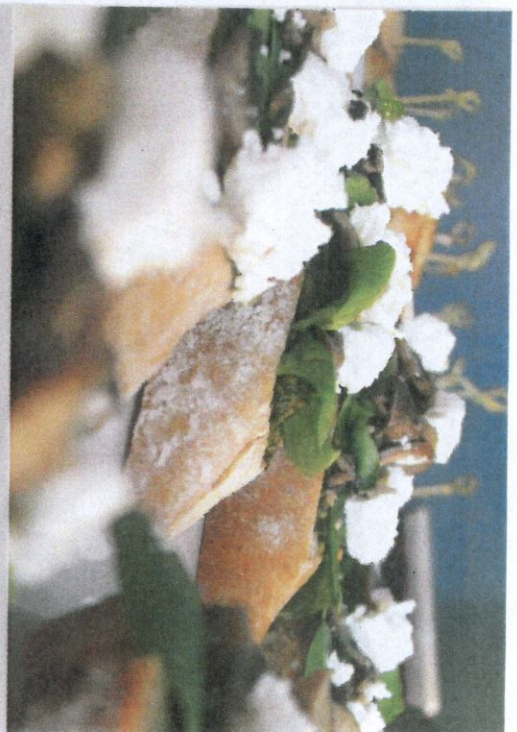

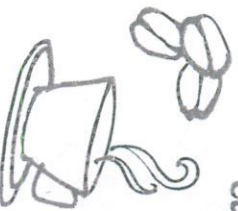
