About the COVID-19 vaccine



The COVID-19 vaccine can help people to

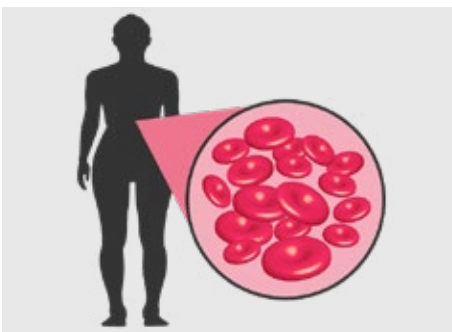
- Not get COVID-19
- Not get very sick from COVID-19.



The COVID-19 vaccine helps your body to deal with COVID-19.



The COVID-19 vaccine makes **antibodies**.



Antibodies are part of your blood.

They help your body deal with getting sick from things like colds or the flu.



There is a group of people that make sure all vaccines in Australia are safe to use.



This group is called the **Therapeutic Goods Administration**.

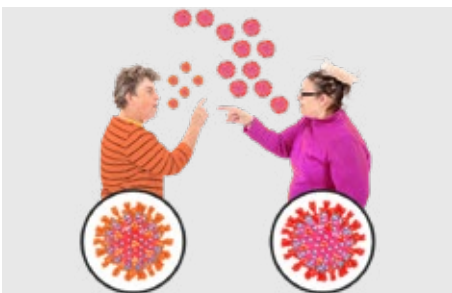
TGA for short.



The TGA tested the COVID-19 vaccine to make sure it is safe.



You can **not** get COVID-19 from the vaccine.



You might still get COVID-19 from another person after you got the COVID-19 vaccine.

After the COVID-19 vaccine



Some people can have **side effects** after they got the COVID-19 vaccine.



A **side effect** is something that can happen to people after they take a medicine.



Most side effects will not be very bad.



You might have things like a headache or tummy ache.

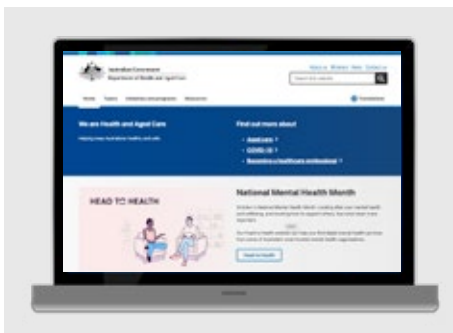
