You can get it at

- Your doctor
- Pharmacy or chemist
- Places run by NDIS service providers
- Aboriginal Community Health services.



You might also be able to have a doctor come to your home to give you the COVID-19 vaccine.

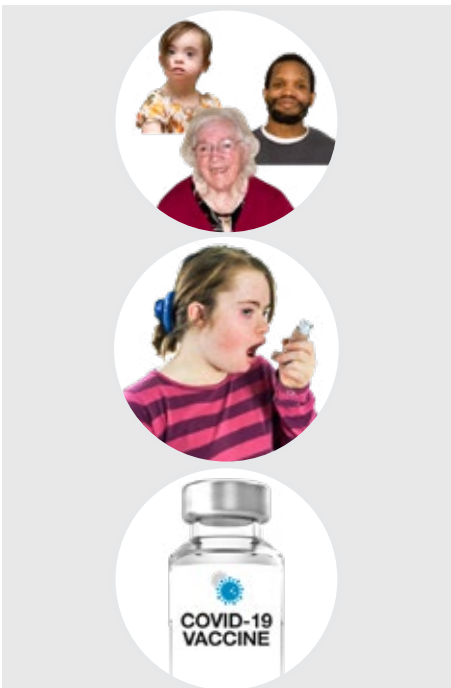
# What COVID-19 vaccine will you get?

# How to book your COVID-19 vaccine

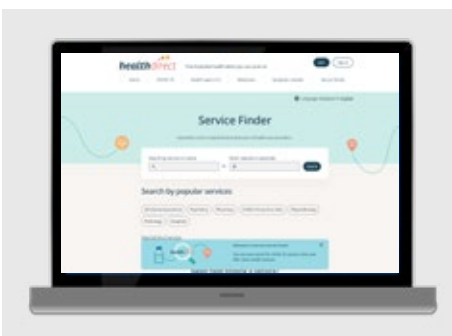


To book your COVID-19 vaccine you can call the place where you want to get it.
