## Issues:

 The Medical Services Advisory Committee (MSAC) held its latest meeting via videoconference on 3 April 2020 and considered 13 items of business. A summary table, by MSAC recommendation (support, defer or not support) is provided at Attachment A.  Assessment of foot and ankle services (Application 1344.2), sponsored by the Australian College of Podiatric Surgeons. The MSAC considered that there remains a lack of directly comparable evidence for safety and effectiveness against surgery performed by orthopaedic surgeons, and the evidence for unmet clinical need remains uncertain.
