Helping aged care providers deliver better outcomes for older people.

Overview

The Department of Health and Aged Care has established a Business to Government (B2G) Application Programming Interface (API) Gateway.

Why is B2G important?

B2G will support aged care reforms by establishing a direct flow of information between aged care providers and Government systems.

For providers, this technology can:

- reduce time spent on administration, enabling workers to spend more time delivering direct and high quality care
- improve data to inform and uplift care
- streamline transparent reporting that demonstrates the quality of care delivered.

For older people, this means they can:

- receive more direct care
- experience an uplift in the quality of care
- be able to access to better information to help make informed decisions about their care.

B2G establishes a direct flow of information between aged care providers and Government.

How will B2G be delivered?

Developed through a co-design process with the sector, the developer portal facilitates seamless interactions between the software community and the department, enhancing provider software integration with Government systems. It offers resources for accessing API specifications and outlines the steps for testing and software conformance assessment, ensuring secure integration with Government systems.

Over time, B2G may expand to include additional aspects of care
