Overview

- This Progress Report is provided for the "Delivery of diagnostic mammography services in Launceston and Hobart" output under the 2019-21 CHHP PA. The \$3 million in Commonwealth funding provided for this output was received by Tasmania in 2020.
- In Tasmania, diagnostic mammograms (and subsequent diagnostic breast imaging) have only been provided through private practice. The funding provided for the delivery of the output has supported the Department of Health (DoH) in exploring the establishment of a Breast Imaging Service which would provide public diagnostic imaging for all Tasmanians.
- Work to establish a public diagnostic mammography service in Tasmania is ongoing with progress continuing in 2022-23. Tasmania is exploring the best model of care for the long-term provision of public diagnostic imaging services. s47B(a)

DoH will ensure that the model of care chosen meets both the service needs of the community and the intended outcomes of the Diagnostic Mammography output under the 2019-21 PA.

Key outputs achieved during the project

Governance and Recruitment

- In January 2021, the Clinical Advisory Group (CAG) was established to discuss current and long-term demand, service, and infrastructure requirements for a public diagnostic mammography service.
- The Breast Care Network, comprising interdisciplinary Tasmanian Health Service staff representing all aspects of the breast cancer screening, diagnosis and treatment pathway, was convened in May 2022. The





I recall you mentioned briefly at the PMG meeting the diagnostic mammography services you are having to stand up in Launceston and Hobart under a Project Agreement with the Commonwealth for the Community Health and Hospitals Program Tasmanian 2019-20 and 2020-21 Initiatives.

You may not be aware, but my team has recently taken on management of this part of the Project Agreement and I was wondering if you could give me a little insight into your understanding of timing and deliverables.

We've been advised that representatives from the Department met with Tasmanian government officials on 25 May 2023 to discuss this project and that the final project report is due September 2023. At the recent meeting, Tasmanian government officials advised that closure of the project will be tied to services being delivered and that this should align with the timing of the final project report due date.

Overview and Background

 This Progress Report is provided for the "Delivery of diagnostic mammography services in Launceston and Hobart" output under the 2019-21 Community Health and Hospitals Program Agreement. The \$3 million in Commonwealth funding provided for this output was received by Tasmania in 2020.

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 The project is now well established, with service delivery having commenced in a staged manner since March 2023. The phases and key deliverables are outlined below.


Key activities undertaken and next steps


PSCP is implementing the project in three phases:


Phase I

- This is the current project phase which involves Saturday clinics at the BST Hobart assessment centre. This centre operates three mammography machines (all with tomosynthesis capability) and two ultrasound machines.
- Phase I clinics provide diagnostic breast imaging to patients as part of their public outpatient or inpatient admission, and began in March 2023.
- The clinics are operating twice per month for internal referrals from THS surgeons, oncologists and the Emergency Department. Twelve clinics have been completed to the end of August 2023, with 70 patients seen and 130 procedures performed.
- The service commenced with a soft rollout as most public patients due for surveillance imaging had already been referred to private providers prior to the commencement of bookings. Clinic sizes have since steadily increased, with 25 of the 70 patients seen by the service having attended in August.
