The **COVID-19 booster** is when you get
another **COVID-19 vaccine.**



A **COVID-19 vaccine** is a medicine that can
stop you getting sick from COVID-19.



You can ask someone for support to read
this information.



This might be a

- Family member
- Friend
- Support worker.

Why it is good to get a COVID-19 booster



It is good to get a COVID-19 booster because it can help stop you getting very sick from COVID-19.



COVID-19 is still in the **community**.

Community means the place where you and others live.



COVID-19 can still make some people with disability very sick.

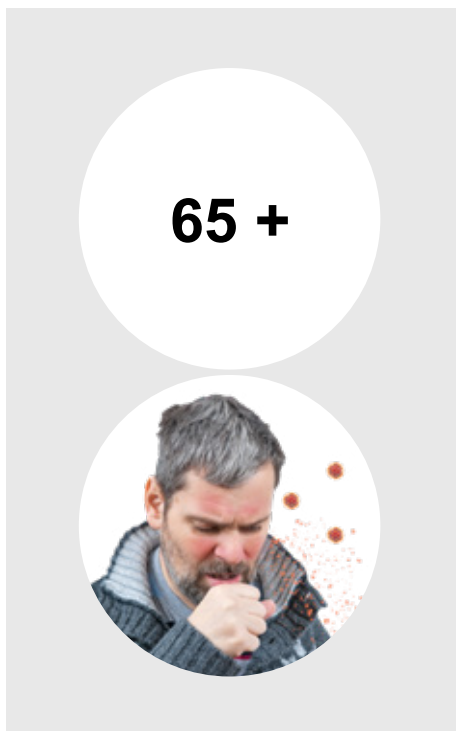


The COVID-19 booster can help keep you safe from getting sick in the community.

Who should get a COVID-19 booster in 2024



You can have at least 1 COVID-19 booster in 2024 if you are 18 or older.



You can get a second COVID-19 vaccine in 2024 if you are

- 65 or older
- **Immunocompromised.**



Immunocompromised means it is harder for your body to not get sick.



But you can only get this when it is 6 months since your last COVID-19 vaccine.



You can talk to your doctor about if you need another COVID-19 vaccine.



You can also talk to

- Your NDIS service

- A **pharmacist**

A **pharmacist** is someone who can give out medicines

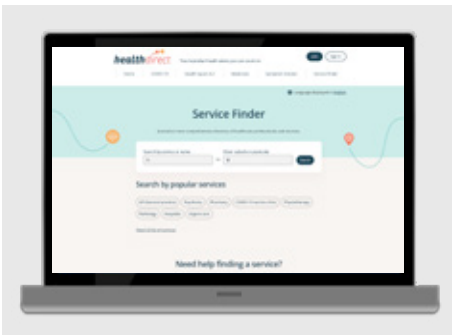
- An Aboriginal health service.

How to book a COVID-19 booster



You can book a COVID-19 booster at a **vaccination service**.

A **vaccination service** is a place where they give people vaccines.



You can use this website to find a vaccination service near you.

A doctor or pharmacist can come to give it to you.

A **Primary Health Network** means health services in your area.



There is also support if you live with other people with disability at an NDIS service.

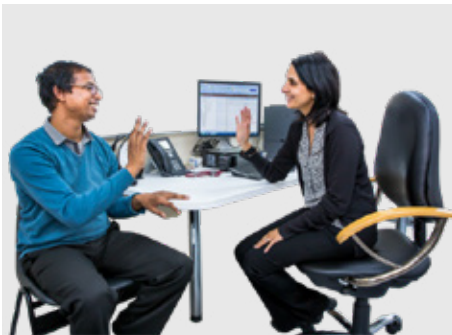


The NDIS service where you live can help you find a vaccination service near you.

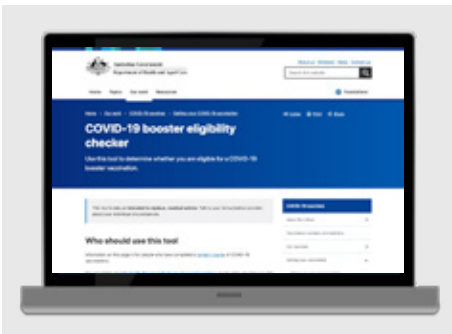

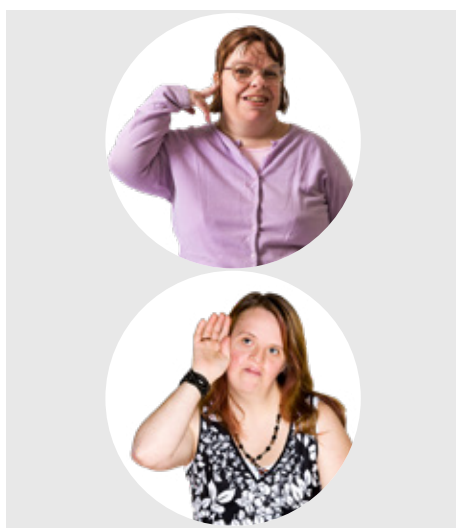
