- Stakeholder and Emergency Management Solution


Business to Government (B2G)

B2G works in unison with GPMS. It is an important innovation that will:


- Streamline transparent reporting that demonstrates the quality of care delivered.

Palliative care: Priority item for aged care

- Aged care sector is heavily involved in caring for older people who are coming to the end of their lives.
- The importance of palliative care in aged care is growing rapidly
 - The Royal Commission into Aged recommended that palliative care be incorporated as core business in aged care.
 - Reform agenda places palliative care at the core of aged care practice.
- Strengthened Aged Care Quality Standards
 - Standard 5, Outcome 5.7 relates to *Palliative and End of Life Care*

Palliative care: sector need

- Aged care service need to provide care that meets the outcomes 5.7 expectation, as well as document and report against this outcome.

There is an opportunity for clinical systems to:

- facilitate quality palliative care processes;
- support reporting of palliative care practice in the sector; and
- Support governance processes around palliative care.

Aged care service needs:

Digitally enabled support for care processes, including end of life care.

Solutions that are evidence based and policy informed.

Systems that are future ready.

How can IT vendors meet service needs?

Creating a product that ticks all the boxes

Robust and adaptable

- Evidence based, policy informed, mapped to reporting requirements.
- Clinically relevant, informs care and improves client outcomes.
- Supports reporting at clinician, managerial and service level.



Unmatched technical strengths

- Does not require external data sharing.
- Optimises existing data.
- Integrates seamlessly into your existing system.
- Adaptable to diverse clinical/care tools used in aged care.



Compelling commercial proposition

- No cost to purchase the framework.
- You integrate, you own!

The Digital Dashboard – What is it?

What is it?

An integrated palliative care dashboard that can track and visually represent key end of life care processes and indicators relevant for reporting and clinical decision making. The dashboard can be shaped to your system and designed to your brand.




Hospitalisation Status

Trialled & tested, value-add established

Integrated implemented, value add established in the real world - The sector wants it


Trial of integration in to 4 groups. One aged care service and 3 external IT providers successfully carried out the integration.

Implementation trial of the Dashboard conducted at 14 Residential aged care sites linked to the IT companies. Clear evidence of feasibility and value-add in supporting end of life care.

Ongoing interest from aged care services to explore the pathways of how they can have the Dashboard embedded into their service's IT system.

Integrating the dashboard into your system

What is ELDAC offering?

- Data variables map and the data dictionary for the dashboard's backend
- +
- Exemplar of the code architecture for the dashboard as a JSON file developed using Angular framework.



Free

What do IT vendors need to do?

- Sign a contract with ELDAC [Flinders] prior to commencing the build.
- Can build it as an embedded model, or via programs such as Power BI
- Put in their developer hours to carry out the dashboard integration work.

How to integrate?

Hard code it into your system or opt for mid-layer integration via Power BI [or equivalent program]

- **Step 1:** Understand and map the data variables to be fed into the dashboard. *Total of under 40 data points.*
- **Step 2:** Identify opportunity for missing data capture and schedule/plan inclusion.
- **Step 3:** Create information architecture and completed programming to create the specified relationships between data fields.
- **Step 4:** Organise a trial of data input and data transfer of the system data to the dashboard.
- **Step 5:** Test performance and release!

How have others integrated it?

- Hard-coded in by one aged care clinical system provider, 2 smaller clinical system providers.
- Power BI based 'mid-layer' integration by one large aged care chain.
- Integration successfully completed within 8 weeks.
- Both services reported over 60% of data variables needed for dashboard to be present in their existing systems.



Integrate ELDAC Dashboard for better palliative care in aged care

- Dashboard helps **meet 17 out of the 34 outcomes** of the upcoming Aged Care Quality Standards. Provides evidence against all action items within **Outcome 5.7**.
- The Dashboard supports the process of **clinical governance** and helps to establish and promote a **culture of safe and quality care at the end of life**.
- Comprehensive care process to support care at the end of life can help early **mitigation of consumer and family complaints**.


