
## **Quarterly Financial Report (QFR)**

The Quarterly Financial Report (QFR) application is now available through the Government Provider

Management System (GPMS)

Organisation Administrators are encouraged to set up their Financial Reporting users in GPMS and check they can access the QFR application


QFR submissions for Quarter 2 2023/24 (reporting period 01 October – 31 December 2023) will open on 01 January 2024



## **Adding Financial Reporting User**

There are two Financial Reporting user roles:

- 1. Financial Reporting Data Entry User
  - Data Entry users can enter data into the QFR but not submit the QFR report
- 2. Financial Reporting Submission User
  - Submission users can enter data and submit the report

"Providers to publicly report on the expenditure of residents' and taxpayers' money – including a breakdown of money spent on caring, nursing, food, maintenance, cleaning, administration and profits"

Government election commitment

#### **Provider Operations Reporting**

"An approved provider must provide an annual report to the Secretary of the Australian Department of Health containing information ... to be made publicly available through My Aged Care"

## Wages Publication

- From late December 2023, the Department will publish a list of all residential and home care providers':
  - minimum
  - average
  - maximum wage rates for registered nurses, enrolled nurses and personal care workers/home care workers.
- The Department will use the wage rates reported by providers through the QFR for Quarter 4 2022-23 and Quarter 1 2023-24 for this publication.
