Becoming an aged care volunteer can be a rewarding and life



Aged care volunteer visitors provide friendship and companionship to older people.



You will make a friend, share ideas and stories, and help someone who might be feeling lonely.



Regular visits from volunteers can help improve quality of life and help people feel less isolated.

There are over **18,000** funded **ACVVS** volunteer placements.



There are currently around **4,150** ACVVS volunteer vacancies. Can you help?







Once you are verified to be a volunteer, the community organisation will provide you with the **training** you need to complete.



Make a friend! Volunteers can expect a tailored matching process to ensure the right fit with an older person.

5. Friendship

As a volunteer, you'll visit for a minimum of one hour per fortnight. You can can visit the older person in their own home, their aged care home or at a public venue.



Use the **Become a Volunteer** form or contact your local ACVVS **Network Member** to register your interest.

You'll then be referred to an ACVVS community organisation in your area, who will support you each step of the way.

2. Meet & greet

The community organisation will contact and support you to complete the application process, including discussing your interests, hobbies, abilities, or preferences.

3. Verification

The community organisation will conduct a **reference check** and the appropriate police check. It may take a few days or weeks for the verification check to be processed.
