### **COP28 Health Day in Dubai**

- 2. It is anticipated the inclusion of a first-ever Health Day at COP28 on 3 December 2023 will raise the profile of climate and health issues at the international climate negotiations.
- 3. Your presence at the COP28 Health Day will further highlight the Government's commitment to action on climate and health to domestic and international stakeholders. Australia's participation in Health Day at COP28 may also contribute to Australia's climate change credentials and our bid to host the United Nations Conference on Climate Change in 2026 (COP31).
- 4. On the Health Day, we propose you attend the Alliance for Transformative Action on Climate and Health (ATACH) roundtable and the climate-health ministerial.
  - a. At COP28, members countries of ATACH will assess progress and agree on next steps to meet their commitments to strengthen the health response to climate change.
  - b. The climate-health ministerial is a new event at COP, where ministers of health, environment, finance and related sectors will set out a roadmap to address the climate-health nexus. A political declaration will be adopted to reflect country priorities on climate change and health and support the mainstreaming of health in the climate agenda.
  - c. A separate Ministerial Submission regarding ATACH is being prepared and will be submitted for your consideration shortly.
- 5. The Department will work closely with your office when organising logistics and briefings. Departmental officials will support you during the meetings. The Consulate-General in Dubai will provide security and logistics support while in Dubai.
- 6. The proposed flights, cost estimates and draft program for your Dubai trip at <u>Attachment</u>
  <u>B</u> are subject to change when further advice on the agenda is provided by the COP28
  Presidency and as the Department engages further with interlocutors.

### Launch of the National Health and Climate Strategy

- 7. The timing of COP28 aligns with the anticipated delivery of Australia's National Health and Climate Strategy in December 2023.
- 8. The Department will provide briefings and further advice on any recommended announcements once the Strategy is finalised, and a proposed release date is confirmed.

### **Background:**

- The United Nations Climate Change Conferences are held annually under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and serve as the formal meeting of the Conference of Parties (COP) to assess progress on climate action.
- The next United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP 28) will take place between 30 November and 12 December 2023 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates. The conference will comprise the 28<sup>th</sup> Conference of Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

**Budget/Financial Implications:** Ministerial travel is covered under the *Parliamentary Business Resources Act 2017* (PBR Act) with funding managed by the Independent Parliamentary Expenses Authority. We estimate total costs for the COP 28 trip will be up to AU\$31,411.31 noting these costs are subject to change in a dynamic travel environment.

Key events and essential purpose of the travel: Assistant Minister Ged Kearney proposes to travel to Dubai from 2-4 December 2023 to represent Australia at the COP28 Health Day on 3 December. Australia is proactively addressing the intersection of health and climate change by participating in the COP28 Health Day on 3 December in Dubai. This event marks the first time a United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP) will have a day dedicated to health and climate.

Assistant Minister Kearney's presence at the COP28 Health Day would demonstrate the Government's genuine commitment to action on climate and health to both domestic and international stakeholders. Australia's participation in Health Day at COP28 may also contribute to Australia's climate change credentials and its bid to host United Nations Conference on Climate Change in 2026 (COP 31).

The unprecedented focus on health at COP28 aligns with the anticipated delivery of Australia's National Health and Climate Strategy at the end of 2023. It provides the opportunity for Assistant Minister Kearney to launch the Strategy among both domestic and international stakeholders, and announce any international commitments to climate and health published within the Strategy.

Assistant Minister Kearney will attend a climate-health ministerial meeting and it is anticipated she will also attend bilateral meetings with several nations including Canada, UK, USA, European Countries and UAE, the host of the COP28. The meetings aim to

foster collaboration, share insights and discuss pivotal international matters in the realms of climate and health.

SUBJECT: For approval: Proposed International Travel Forecast: 1 October 2023 - 30 June 2024

### **Purpose**

The Executive Committee has requested a regular forecast of international travel to give visibility of the Department's international travel program, streamline approval processes, and encourage early approval to obtain the best possible airfares. This paper provides proposed international travel by department officials for the period 1 October 2023 – 30 June 2024 (Attachment A).

### **Key issues**

Travel has been proposed by the Chief Medical Officer Group, Health Strategy, First Nations and Sport Group, Primary and Community Care Group and Health Resourcing Group. Given its extensive cost-recovered travel program, the Health Products Regulatory Group has a separate process to obtain travel approvals.

The Financial Business Rule (FBR) R2.5 Official Travel – Overseas notes that in-principle approval by the Secretary is required through the quarterly forecast of international travel. Following in-principle approval by the Secretary, the costs and final arrangements for forecasted trips may then be approved by the relevant Deputy Secretary, with the following exceptions:

- 1. The Minister needs to approve travel by the Secretary or travel where the total cost of the delegation is over \$50,000.
- 2. The Secretary approves travel by Deputy Secretaries.
- 3. The FAS HSSD and FAS Medical Regulation Division may approve international travel for outposted staff within their region (Europe and South-east Asia respectively).
- 4. Travel by Health Products Regulation Group officers below SES and MO5 are approved by the Deputy Secretary.

Any travel outside this forecast process and exemptions requires separate approval by the Secretary.

Previous forecasts have highlighted efforts to reduce delegation size and review costs. Justification for travel is included in the forecast. Financial Management Division is currently undertaking a review of the *International Travel Policy* in consultation with impacted areas to identify opportunities to reduce the overall cost of international travel. This work is expected to be completed by the end of the year. Delays in finalising bookings arrangements can significantly increase the costs of international travel (particularly flight costs). Areas travelling are encouraged to finalise approvals and bookings early to minimise costs.

A refreshed <u>international engagement strategy</u> by early 2024 will also help set international priorities and support the rationale for international travel engagements that advance the Department's business.



- A successful launch event for the Strategy, attended by an estimated over 70 Australian and international stakeholders, including:
  - o Vanuatu's Minister for Health,
  - o the Chief Sustainability Officer for the National Health Service in England,
  - Australia's Ambassador for First Nations People, and professors from the Healthy Environment and Lives (HEAL) network and the Lowitja Institute.
- Participation in bilateral meetings with government representatives from the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Fiji, Vanuatu, and the CEO of AstraZeneca.
  - Governments agreed to exchange further resources and experiences developing programs for health adaptation, health system resilience, health system decarbonisation and for the establishment of Centres of Disease Control.
- Participation in a multilateral meeting with representatives from the United States, the National Health Service in England, Canada, Ireland, Norway and Belgium on aligning procurement requirements for net zero health systems and decarbonisation of the international supply chain.
  - Attendees agreed to support further collaboration and extend invitations to other countries, and planned an announcement of countries participating in the collaboration to align health system procurement requirements at Earth Day on 22 April 2024.
  - This will support progression of Action 4.17 (Objective 2) and Action 5.2 (Objective 3) in the Strategy.
- Participation in the inaugural Climate-Health Ministerial at COP28 Health Day (additional information on ATACH and COP28 in <u>Attachment A</u>).
  - Assistant Minister Kearney announced the launch of the Strategy and Australia's commitment to join ATACH.
  - Participants, including Australia, endorsed the COP28 Declaration on Climate and Health, signalling a joint commitment to the advancement of climate-resilient development, the strengthening of health systems, and the building of resilient and thriving communities, for the benefit of present and future generations.


