Whereas:

- A: The Parties entered into the Agreement dated 16 August 2006 (the "Principal Funding Agreement").
- B: The Principal Funding Agreement has been varied before on 16 March 2007, 16 April 2007 and 30 May 2007.
- C: Clause 1.6 states that no variation will be effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- D: The parties now wish to vary the Principal Agreement.

Schedule C to the Principal Funding Agreement is varied as follows:

Add: Item A – PROJECTS (clauses 1.1 and 3)

Purpose: One off funds of \$165,000 (GST Inclusive) are provided to Katungul Aboriginal Corporation Community & Medical Services as a contribution towards the construction of a multipurpose outreach centre for the delivery of a range of government and non-government services to the Wallaga Lake community.

Funds provided as a contribution toward the construction of a multipurpose outreach centre for the delivery of a range of government and non-government services to the Wallaga Lake community will only be expended by the organisation once:

- a final construction option is decided with the agreement of the Queanbeyan Indigenous Coordination Centre (ICC) and Department of Health and Ageing (DoHA);
- details of the internal configuration of the building are agreed with the ICC and DoHA;
- a memorandum of understanding is signed between Katungul AMS and the auspice engaged to manage the centre, with the agreement of the ICC and DoHA, clearly stating the separate and shared roles and responsibilities of the two organisations;

- the governance structure for the management of the centre is agreed between the ICC, DoHA and all participating organisations;
- a lease is signed between Merriman's Local Aboriginal Land Council and the auspice engaged to manage the outreach centre.

WALLAGA LAKE - MULTIPURPOSE OUTREACH CENTRE

Purpose

To seek your approval to:

- provide \$150,000 (GST Inclusive) of one-off 2006-07 uncommitted program funds to Katungul Aboriginal Corporation Community and Medical Services (Katungul AMS) as DoHAs contribution toward the construction of a multipurpose outreach centre for the delivery of a range of government and non government services to the Wallaga Lake community; and
- waive the requirement for three quotes to be sourced prior to the purchase of such services, on the basis that it is not practical, as allowed for under Clause 13.4 of the Office of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health (OATSIH) Standard Funding Agreement.

And ask that you note that:

- DoHAs funding contribution to the construction of the centre will form part of its contribution to an SRA that is being developed by the Queanbeyan Indigenous Coordination Centre (ICC); and that
- 4. additional funding in 2007-08 for coordinator and receptionist positions at the centre, additional fit-out, and ongoing maintaince costs of the building will be sought by the ICC from participating Australian and State government agencies and those organisations providing services from the centre.

Background

The Whole-of-Government work at Wallaga Lake has raised the profile of the health needs of this community within DoHA and has highlighted the lack of an appropriate response by our locally funded health services. In response to this Katungul AMS commenced a monthly GP/Health Worker clinic at Wallaga Lake, however, the clinic is being run out of substandard premises which must either be repaired or alternative accommodation found.

The ICC has been negotiating with the community and a range of government and nongovernment service providers regarding the establishment of a multipurpose outreach centre. The expectation is that the centre would enhance service provision to the community across a range of services in the short term and develop skills within the community around accessing services so that the community can transition to using some services (including mainstream services) off Wallaga Lake in the medium term. The draft ICC Wallaga Lake Mulitpurpose Outreach Centre proposal is provided at Attachment A.

Options

Two options are currently being considered for the construction of a multipurpose outreach centre:

- 1. the lease/purchase of a demountable building; or the
- 2. renovation of an existing building owned by Merriman's Local Aboriginal Land Council and currently being used by Katungul AMS for their monthly clinic.

Option 2 is the preferred option as it utilises an existing building that has previously been used as a health clinic for the community and for the delivery of other government funded services. This option also addresses a perception by State government and the community that a demountable building is a temporary commitment and provides an permanent clinic space.

The final decision on a construction option will be made on the basis of value for money, availability of funding from other sources and community input.

Auspice

Katungul AMS is the proposed auspice organisation for the construction of the building due to their existing responsibility for health service delivery to this community. However, it should be noted that Katungul was rated as a Service of Concern in OATSIHs most recent risk assessment process in February 2007.

These risks have, to a large extent, been addressed by the appointment of an experienced CEO on 14 May 2007 for a period of three years; and the development of an OATSIH risk management plan which has been discussed and agreed with the organisation. These risks and mitigating factors were considered by both OATSIH and ICC in proposing Katungul as the auspice organisation. OATSIH will assess the organisations risk rating again in six months.

SRA status

It is intended that the funding will form part of the Department's contribution to an SRA currently being developed by the Queanbeyan ICC. The SRA will also incorporate funding for the coordinator and receptionist positions at the centre, additional fit-out, and the ongoing maintaince costs of the building.

Budget

The range of estimated costs for the two options under consideration is \$238,843 to \$427,649. Please refer the comparison table at Attachment B.

OATSIH is limited to providing a maximum of \$150,000 (GST Inclusive) for any one off minor capital works project. As such, the ICC is seeking additional funding for the remainder of the construction costs from other Australian Government and NSW State Government agencies. In addition, Katungul AMS have also committed their estimated 2006-07 underspend of approximately \$93,000 toward the construction costs, pending approval by OATSIH.

To show faith with the local community it is proposed that OATSIH commit \$150,000 (GST Inclusive) from 2006-07 Expansion and Enhancement funds while the ICC continues its negotiations with the community and other agencies to finalise the construction option and secure the additional funds required.

Funding would be transferred to Katungul AMS on the condition that it be held until:

- a final construction option is decided with the agreement of the ICC and DoHA;
- · details of the internal configuration of the building are agreed with the ICC and DoHA;
- a memorandum of understanding is signed between Katungul AMS and the auspice
 engaged to manage the centre, with the agreement of the ICC and DoHA, clearly stating
 the separate and shared roles and responsibilities of the two organisations;
- the governance structure for the management of the centre is agreed between the ICC,
 DoHA and all participating organisations;
- a lease is signed between Merriman's Local Aboriginal Land Council and the auspice engaged to manage the outreach centre.

In the event that these conditions cannot be fulfilled Katungul AMS would be required to return the funds to OATSIH.

Quotes

Katungul AMS have received an Opinion of Probable Cost (OPC) from K20 Architecture for the lease/purchase of two configurations of a demountable and a quote from Pearce and Percy Constructions for the renovation of the existing building. In addition, the renovation quote has been independently verified by the construction firm Davis Langdon as being a fair and reasonable estimate of the cost for the works.

Clause 13.2 of the OATSIH standard funding agreement states that:

Where the purchase price of an Asset or service is equal to or greater than \$5,000, including GST, the organisation must either obtain written quotes or publicly invite tenders from at least 3 suitable suppliers. The Organisation may proceed with fewer than 3 quotes in circumstances where it is not possible or practicable to obtain 3 or more quotes, but must inform the Department within 30 days of doing so.

Katungul AMS has put forward the case that it has not been practicable for them to obtain three quotes for all services associated with the building due to the short timeframes involved, changing scope of the project and limited staffing capacity.

In the event that funding is approved special conditions will be included in the variation requiring: appropriate quotes to be received for each component of the work prior to it being incurred; and any unspent funds to be either returned to the Department or an application made for their redirection towards additional work associated with this project in accordance with Clauses 13 and 16 of the OATSIH standard funding agreement.

Authorisation

You have the delegation to approve proposals to spend public money of up to \$100m in accordance with Item 108 of Schedule 1 of the Financial Delegations and Authorisations, 1 January 2003; and

Under OATSIH Operational Rule number 2, you can approve new one-off funds or approve a variation to the purpose of one-off funds.

Funds availability

Funds to the amount of \$150,000 (GST Inclusive) are available from uncommitted program funds (\$130,000 from the Expansion and Enhancement Program and \$30,000 from the Primary Health Care Access Program) for redistribution. The NSW State Office 2006-07 allocation for Primary Health Care Program is noted in the ORAC printout at Attachment C.

Recommendation

It is recommended that you:

- approve the provision of \$150,000 (GST Inclusive) of one-off 2006-07 uncommitted program funds to Katungul Aboriginal Corporation Community and Medical Services (Katungul AMS) as DoHAs contribution toward the construction of a multipurpose outreach centre for the delivery of a range of government and non government services to the Wallaga Lake community; and

- 4. additional funding for coordinator and receptionist positions at the centre, additional fitout, and ongoing maintaince costs of the building will be sought by the ICC from participating Australian and State government agencies and those organisations providing services from the centre.





Draft proposal for the Wallaga Lake Multi Purpose Outreach Centre

Purpose of this document:

To outline the proposed Wallaga Lake multi purpose outreach centre, including its aims, proposed auspicing arrangements, premises, staffing, governance and funding required through an SRA.

To seek financial support from NSW and Commonwealth Government agencies for the proposal.

Background

Wallaga Lake has been identified as a community requiring intensive intervention by the Queanbeyan ICC. It has also been identified as a partnership community by the NSW Department of Aboriginal Affairs (DAA). The ICC has spent 18 months engaging with the Wallaga Lake community on a number of issues including family violence, leadership development and working with Wallaga Lake community organisations. This work has intensified through the recent action undertaken by the NSW Premiers Department who have led whole of government action in response to a number of reports indicating increasing community stress and dysfunction.

SRA

Wallaga Lake community members have identified a need for better access to services including primary health, employment, family and community services. This has been identified through the Community Working Party (CWP) and the Community Engagement Day held 6 February 2007.

It is appropriate to include the centre in a comprehensive SRA as the concept of a multipurpose centre requires funding support from a number of agencies, and to ensure appropriate "buy in" from community, government and non-government stakeholders.

In addition to negotiating the outreach centre, the ICC Manager is negotiating with Eurobodalla Shire Council and the Merriman's Aboriginal Land Council regarding installing street lighting, developing a sporting oval and improving other municipal type services. This would be Stage 2 of the SRA as a separate schedule to the SRA.

A comprehensive SRA that supports improved service delivery and community infrastructure will deliver on community priorities identified through Whole-of-Government engagement with the Wallaga Lake community.

Need and support for the Centre

It has come to the attention of the ICC through the Whole-of Government work being undertaken within the community, that having premises for organisations to deliver and broker services would strengthen the capacity of this community to access a range of primary health, employment, family and community services on and off Wallaga Lake. It is envisaged

that strong and consistent engagement is needed with the community to develop trust in the local service providers.

The proposal for a multi purpose outreach centre has received strong support at various community meetings, including a Community Engagement Day that was convened by DAA at Wallaga Lake on 6 February 2007, a number of meetings with the Wallaga Community Working Party (most recently 27 February 2007) and the Merriman's Land Council.

Support for this proposal has been shown from government service providers at officer level, including both the Bega Valley Shire Council and the Eurobodalla Shire Council; local State Government agencies including NSW Health (Greater Southern Area Health Service), DoCS, the Police, Probation and Parole, Juvenile Justice; and other Australian Government agencies including DoHA, FaCSIA, Centrelink, DEWR, and DEST. Many other non-government service providers have also shown support and interest in providing services at the centre.

Outreach Centre Model/Scope

It is proposed that the multi purpose outreach centre would have a life of three years in the first instance with the objective of community members transitioning to accessing mainstream and Indigenous specific services off Wallaga Lake. A strong element of this proposal is a focus on how to improve access to services (eg transport, cultural safety, cost and choice of services).

Staff at the Centre

A Coordinator/Community Developer and Administration Support Officer positions at the Centre are proposed and are seen as key to the successful functioning of the centre. The Coordinator will have a complex role; to facilitate improved access to primary health, employment, family and community services for the Wallaga Lake community, liaison with the managers/CEOs of the services at the Centre, workers at the centre and the community. They will also be expected to undertake community capacity building activities, coordinate transport options for the community and provide referrals to other services off Wallaga Lake. The Administration Support Officer will support the coordinator, provide reception duties and take bookings for services and course/talks provided by services at the centre. We expect the Administration Support Officer will be recruited from the local community and will play an important linking role to the Wallaga Lake community and families. See Attachment A for draft duty statement of the Coordinator position.

Staff at the centre will be employed by an appropriate auspice, yet to be determined.

Services at the Centre

Meetings and one-on-one discussions have been recently held with the local health, employment, family and community services to gauge interest in delivering services from a building within the community. There has been considerable interest, 4 health services, 4 employment services, 1 education, 1 legal and 5 family and community service providers have expressed an interest. Services have been asked what their preferred amount of time is at the centre and the type of room they need. Using this information a "mock-up" month of the

services using the building has been drafted to demonstrate the extent to which the facility will be utilised (see Attachment B).

At least 11 of the 15 organisations interested in providing services at the proposed outreach centre are funded by both Australian and NSW Government agencies. Four are almost entirely State Government funded.

Management and Governance

Auspice of Building

The Department of Health and Ageing (DoHA) has been working with the South Coast Medical Service Aboriginal Corporation (SCMSAC) as the potential auspice for outreach centre building funds.

SCMSAC obtained a quote for the renovation of an existing building at Wallaga Lake owned by the Merriman's Land Council. This quote was found to be too high to be feasible at this stage. The option of funding a demountable building at Wallaga Lake is currently being investigated. DoHA is offering to fund the building from 2006-07 funds for a period of 2-3 years (depending on the quote received). The DoHA funding contribution for the building could be wrapped up post-hoc in the SRA as it is negotiated.

The lead time required to have the building functioning on site is approximately 3-4 months and could allow for the negotiation of the SRA.

Auspice of Centre Management

It is proposed that the auspice of the management of the Wallaga Lake multi purpose outreach centre and staff would be undertaken by an independent, un-biased high performing organisation. Given the number of organisations that have an interest in delivering services at the centre it is a challenge to determine a truly independent auspice. The ICC is considering a number of options that would best deliver outcomes for all stakeholders. Options were determined after feedback from meetings held with the community and health, employment and family/community services that are interested in providing services at the centre. Further discussion will be held with the Community Working Party.

Option 1

Wallaga Lake Koori Village is situated at the southern end of the Eurobodalla Local Government Area and has close ties with Bermagui, which is in the Bega Valley Local Government Area. Both Eurobodalla Shire Council and Bega Valley Shire Council deliver social services to the residents of Wallaga Lake and Bermagui.

A partnership between the two Shire Councils to auspice the management of the Wallaga Lake multi purpose outreach centre is an option being investigated. Bega Valley Shire Council and Eurobodalla Shire Council have both been approached by the ICC and are interested to discuss the project in more detail.

Option 2

A number of primary health, employment and family and community service providers have expressed interest in delivering services at the centre. A Reference Group, consisting of CEOs and/or Senior Managers of organisations who regularly use the Centre could, in partnership form an auspice for the management of the centre. Clear Terms of Reference for the group will be determined that outline the relationship between the Co-ordinator, Administration Support Officer and Reference Group. The Coordinator would report regularly to the Reference Group. One organisation could act as a funds holder and pay the worker's salaries (for an administration fee).

Advisory Group

The management and governance of the outreach centre will be in part determined by the auspice arrangements. The auspice of the outreach centre will recruit and supervise the two staff positions.

An Advisory Group that focuses on service delivery issues should include representatives of CEOs from organisations using the centre, community/client representatives and staff delivering services at the centre. It will be important throughout the life of the project to determine how appropriately the centre is addressing client and service provider needs. In the first year of the project the Co-ordinator would convene quarterly meetings of the Advisory Group to allow feedback on service delivery. Staff Management would remain the responsibility of the auspice.

The Wallaga Lake Community Working Party (CWP) will be the first point of contact for determining community and client representation for the Advisory Group.

SCMSAC as auspice for the building will have a significant relationship with the auspice for centre management and the Advisory Group.

- To facilitate improved access to primary health, employment, youth and family services for the Wallaga Lake community.
- 2. Liaise with a number of sectors (eg State and Australian Government, NGOs) about their service provision into the centre.
- 3. Liaise with community members to assess health needs in the community. Undertake a community development approach to community consultation.
- 4. Liaise with the community regarding ongoing arrangements for involving the community (eg advisory group).
- 5. Negotiate and maintain a timetable of visiting services to the centre.
- 6. Communicate with the individuals, and families of the Wallaga Lake community about visiting services and upcoming events (eg publicise timetable of visiting services).





In November 2007 the Queanbeyan Indigenous Coordination Centre signed a Shared Responsibility Agreement with the Wallaga Lake Community for the construction of an Outreach Centre at Wallaga Lake. The centre will function as a hub for the delivery of multiple government services (Commonwealth and State) to the community, including health, family justice, employment and education. A Coordinator and Community Engagement Officer will be employed to work with the community in accessing services. The Department has contributed \$150,000 to the construction and \$100,000 to the on-going operations of the centre.

Katungul originally agreed to project manage the construction of the centre. In October 2007 it was agreed with Katungul that another organisation be found to undertake the project management role. Eurobodalla Shire Council has agreed to project manage the construction of the centre and employ and manage staff. The estimated completion date for construction is September 2008.





confirmed that no additional recurrent funding was available in 07.08 and outlined the position regarding reallocation of OATSIH's Wallaga Lake Outreach Centre funding contribution from Katungul to the Eurobodalla Shire Council. These funds were being held by Katungul as quarantined funds for a specific purpose and were not available for general PHC funding. As such their reallocation to another organisation would not have an impact on Katungul's financial position.



5. Current status of Katungul's PHC provision to Wallaga Lake community e-mail of 2 March '08 advised that Katungul has discontinued their fortnightly clinic at Wallaga Lake due to OH&S concerns for their staff and clients. As an interim measure pending the construction of the outreach centre Katungul will facilitate access to PHC services for the Wallaga Lake community by additional transport services as per Variation 1 of the 2007-08 Funding Agreement.

I called your office this morning and left a message for you. However I did miss a call this afternoon while I was attending a meeting with the ANU in Canberra regarding developing an MOU and Partnership so that Katungul will take Medical, RN, Midwifery, and Psych Students plus also looking at a GP Registrar position for Katungul.

Reason for my call is that I wish to take you up on your offer you gave me a few months ago regarding talking directly to you regarding any issues. Well we certainly have a few issues that I wish to take up with you now as we feel that our requests (phone calls, discussions, reports and submissions) over the past 12 months are not being addressed adequately or possibly misunderstood and or misguided. This is the reason why lately I have felt the need to Cc you on some correspondence/issues after having discussions with \$22 \text{ ... I do wish to discuss this particular matter with you but would prefer to do that in-person.

My call to you today is regarding this - As you are aware from our recent correspondence/submissions/reports Katungul has had to deal with major and ongoing serious OH&S issues in relation to buildings, and staff (workers compensation, terminations etc etc). This obviously has had a major impact in relation to Katungul having to comply with OH&S legislation and our funding. OATSIH also gave Katungul a man date to deal with a number of operational issues that we completed before OATSIHs man-date (such as all short and long term workers compensation cases). Katungul also instigated an independent fraud and audit and operational review while I came on as acting CEO from SCMSAC. There were also a number of other items we had to comply with regarding OATSIH quality/continuous improvement agenda for accreditation that have had a severe drain on our resources. Additional accounting was also required regarding the financials. Other such issues out of our control were asbestos technical report (I'm not sure if you have been briefed correctly on this but the Asbestos at Katungul Bega was disturbed before the Asbestos Engineering Report and Capital

Works Scoping Study Report were commenced after electrical wiring and lighting had to be fixed due to power shortages and equipment failures as 2 electrical switchboards there were not earthed as per electrical/building standards). Other additional costs have been additional clinic/GP hours for GPs RNs and Health Workers for Wallaga Lake and also the fact that we now do not receive salary reimbursement for \$47F // as he is now a Katungul employee.

I do not believe that we will have enough OATSIH funding to last us until we receive our next quarter funding. Also I request your consideration of approving the request we recently wrote to you about not reducing our next quarter payment due to costs etc involved with OH&S issues as detailed above and as also provided to OATSIH in various reports and submissions. We had no option but to comply with the OH&S issues that we were faced with after the OH&S Reports (Risk Management with possible/potential litigation from staff and or clients). Further FYI OATSIH has already reduced our next quarter payment (funds of \$144,400 to go to Eurobodalla Council for Wallaga Lake facility).

Recovery of Wallaga Lake Outreach Centre Funds

Further to discussions held between Katungul, OATSIH and the Queanbeyan Indigenous Coordination Centre (QICC) at the Katungul Board meeting of 16 October 2007, regarding a potential change of auspice for the Wallaga Lake Outreach Centre funding, OATSIH has recently been advised by the QICC that the Eurobodalla Shire Council has agreed to project manage the construction of the Wallaga Lake Outreach Centre, including auspicing the funds for the project.

As such, OATSIH in now seeking the recover the funds previously provided to Katungul for this purpose (Variation 4 of the 2006/07 Funding Agreement signed on 15 June), so that they can be reallocated to the Eurobodalla Shire Council.

OATSIH proposes that Katungul utilise the funds already held for the project to fund primary health care activity in line with your 2007/08 Primary Health Care budget, with an equivalent amount to be withheld from Katungul's 3rd quarter 2007/08 payment.

As confirmed by **\$11C** on 10 December 2007 Katungul is holding \$144,440.00 (GST Exclusive) for the Wallaga Lake Outreach Centre project, as such this amount will be withheld from Katungul's 3rd quarter payment on 5th January 2008.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Katungul Board for it's commitment toward this project, in particular for your responsiveness and flexibility in assisting with the development of the outreach centre proposal.
