






### Bulk Billing Rate Change by Broad Type of Service







## GP NRA Bulk Billing Rate












# GP Non-Referred Attendances – Bulk Billing Rate by PHN, 2023-24 Jul-Dec YTD







# GP Non-Referred Attendances (GP NRA) by SEIFA and Age Group, 2023-24 Jul-Dec YTD

In 2023-24 Jul-Dec YTD, the **GP NRA bulk** billing rate in the most disadvantaged areas was 87.0%, 10.5% percentage points higher than the national GP NRA bulk billing rate of 76.5% for the same period.

The Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA) are published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics and rank areas in Australia according to socio-economic variables.


The measures (services, bulk billing rate and average patient contribution) on this page are shown against the Index of Relative Socio-Economic Disadvantage (IRSD).

Areas are more likely to be identified as disadvantaged if there are many:


- · households with low income,
