
Bulk Billing Rate








Bulk Billing Rate by Selected Service Types



GP NRA Bulk Billing Rate












GP Non-Referred Attendances – Bulk Billing Rate by PHN, 2024-25





In 2024-25, the GP NRA bulk billing rate in the most disadvantaged areas was 88.0%, 10.2% percentage points higher than the national GP NRA bulk billing rate of 77.9% for the same period last year.

The Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA) are published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics and rank areas in Australia according to socio-economic variables.




- households with low income,
