

## Key messages

- Aged care is changing so that eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 50 years or older have faster and simpler access to more culturally safe and appropriate aged care services.
- The Aged Care Act is the main law regulating the aged care system. It includes an important Statement of Rights.
- This means that older Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have the right to:
  - get the information they need and choose what their care looks like
  - access top quality care that is culturally safe
  - have their privacy respected
  - raise issues when something isn't right
  - speak in language and take part in cultural activities
  - stay connected to community and Country
