COMMITMENT APPROVAL TO PURCHASE 3 X FIVECAST ONYX PRO LICENCES THROUGH FIVECAST PTY LTD FOR A 12-MONTH PERIOD.

PURPOSE

This Minute recommends that you:

- R1. **APPROVE** the indemnity clause in the contract which is in favour of Fivecast Pty Ltd in accordance with section 60 of the *Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013* (PGPA Act), as outlined in the Section 60 Assessment section of this minute. s47E(d)
- R2. **APPROVE** the expenditure of Departmental funds of **\$107,250.00 (GST inclusive)**, for the purchase of three Fivecast Onyx Pro licences from Fivecast Pty Ltd (**ABN: 48 621 030 199**), under Section 23(3) of the PGPA Act;
- R3. **NOTE** the quotation/proposal from Fivecast Pty Ltd at **Attachment B**;
- R4. **NOTE** the funds availability confirmation at **Attachment C**;
- R5. **NOTE** Fivecast Onyx Pro has been approved for use within the Department (Enterprise Architecture and Cyber Security) via Cherwell ticket 4035187;
- R6. **NOTE** the mechanism of purchase will be issuing a purchase order that operates under the terms and conditions of the End User Licensing Agreement (EULA) at **Attachment A**; and
- R7. **SIGN** the attached manual purchase order at **Attachment D**.

1. SECTION 60 PGPA ACT APPROVAL

Contracts which contain a contingent liability cannot be entered into without being approved in accordance with s60 of the PGPA Act.

Table 3 of Schedule 1 of the Departments Delegations states that the Section 23(3) delegate for any engagement also has the Section 60 delegation for that same engagement. Resultantly, you have the Delegation to approve the indemnity clause in this agreement. Accountable Authority Instructions 2.2 and Finance Business Rule R2.2 provide the Department's rules and guidance for assessing risk and providing section 60 Approval.

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It is recommended that Section 60 Approval is provided in accordance with the Finance Business Rule R2.2 and as per Department Financial Delegations to address the PGPA Section 60 requirement.

Please note that if you decide against providing section 60 approval then you are unable to provide section 23(3) approval to procure licenses from Fivecast Pty Ltd.

2. BACKGROUND/CONTEXT

To address the growing complexity and volume of intelligence referrals, the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) Intelligence Team requires advanced Open Source Intelligence (OSINT) tools to enhance its operational capabilities. Current manual methods of data collection are time-consuming, limited in scope, and increasingly inadequate for identifying non-compliant activities across digital platforms.

Fivecast Onyx offers transformative capabilities including deep web access, cross-platform social media analysis, and automated data aggregation, which significantly reduce turnaround times and improve the accuracy and depth of intelligence reporting. Investing in this tool will enable the team to deliver timely, comprehensive intelligence products, support strategic regulatory functions, and achieve greater efficiency than would be possible through additional staffing alone.

Fivecast Onyx is used by a number of federal government agencies including:

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A proposal has been prepared by the vendor (**Attachment B**). This requirement has been confirmed by the relevant business owner s47F, Regulatory Practice and Support Division.

3. TIMEFRAME

Support and maintenance for Fivecast Onyx Pro will be provided from 1 July 2025 – 30 June 2026.

4. VALUE FOR MONEY

The proposed OSINT tool, FIVECAST Onyx, was identified by the Department's Intelligence Forum as a preferred solution due to its proven use across other government agencies and its advanced capabilities, including dark web access, AI-driven analytics, and secure persona-based investigations. These features significantly surpass the limitations of manual intelligence methods. The decision to proceed with Fivecast Onyx was informed by qualitative feedback from analysts, its alignment with key intelligence priorities—such as timeliness, reach, and reliability—and a thorough review of licensing and implementation costs. It offers a scalable solution that enhances the TGA's intelligence capability while delivering a strong return on investment. Accordingly, the purchase of these licenses represents value for money to the Department.

5. CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENT

The licenses will be purchased via the issuing of a purchase order and will be provided under the conditions of the EULA. The nominated Contract Manager for this arrangement will be the Director,

Procurement and Software Commercials Team, EPMC. Business Ownership and approval given through s47F, Director, Governance and Integrity Section, Regulatory Practice and Support Division.

6. COMPLIANCE WITH COMMONWEALTH PROCUREMENT RULES

This procurement is above the relevant threshold (\$80,000.00 GST inclusive) and therefore the additional rules for procurements at or above the relevant procurement threshold in Division 2 of the Commonwealth Procurement Rules will apply. The Value for Money considerations found in Division 1 have been applied.

The Commonwealth Procurement Rules state that Commonwealth entities must only conduct a procurement at or above the relevant procurement threshold through limited tender when a specific condition for limited tender is met. In this instance, the relevant conditions for limited tender are as follows:

- 10.3.d - when the goods and services can be supplied only by a particular business and there is no reasonable alternative or substitute for one of the following reasons:*
- ii. to protect patents, copyrights, or other exclusive rights, or proprietary information; AND*
 - iii. due to an absence of competition for technical reason*

Fivecast software provides an open-source intelligence platform for obfuscated monitoring and collection of publicly available information. This is proprietary software and no suitable alternative is available from any vendor.

7. INDIGENOUS PROCUREMENT POLICY

The expected value of the procurement is between \$80,000 and \$200,000, however, this procurement uses a 10.3 exemption, so the mandatory set-aside does not apply.

8. EXPENDITURE APPROVAL AND FUNDS AVAILABILITY

The cost to the Department for this purchase is **\$107,250.00** (GST inclusive). This is within your delegation limit under the Accountable Authority Financial Delegations Schedule 1, Table 1, Item 54, to approve proposals to commit relevant money up to \$1,000,000.00.

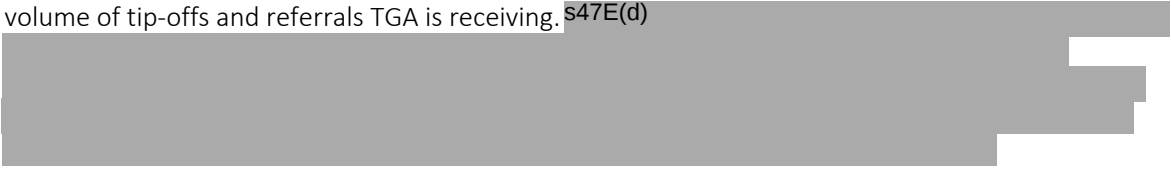

Intelligence objectives

The HRRG Intelligence Team aims to produce value-added intelligence to answer key intelligence questions pertinent to the **TGA Advertising, Import and Supply Compliance Priorities** and RCB and VIEB investigations.

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OSINT Tools

OSINT tools exponentially expand data volumes and provide deeper insights into this ever-increasing set of data. **These tools allow us to do things we cannot do manually.** The benefits of OSINT tools are plentiful:

Options and Analysis

There is a community of practice with other intel areas in the Department, with monthly engagement.

- As a group, they are looking at future resourcing together:
 1. **RCB Intel** - have responsibility for the capability uplift s47E(d)
 2. **Fraud and Integrity** - s47E(d)
 3. **Benefits Integrity** - s47E(d)

Interagency discussion and online research identified two potential vendors offering services highly conducive to TGA regulatory work.

Testing

The intel team has undertaken testing of two OSINT tools from these vendors:

- FIVECAST Onyx and
- NexusXplore

The Intelligence team undertook a work-based assessment of these two OSINT software platforms to ascertain the best fit for purpose and value for money (see attachment – HPRG Intelligence – OSINT Test Review for the full comparative assessment). Both tools aim to give analysts a significant edge by delivering rich, relevant, and accurate information that the intelligence team can use for intelligence assessments.

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Although the trial period for both products offered valuable insights into their usefulness, the complete potential of these tools has yet to be fully realised. We believe that they could have a significant impact in the digital disruption arena, particularly in streamlining processes and enhancing operational efficiency. However, until the team conducts a thorough exploration of all the features and functionalities, we cannot determine the true scope of the benefits the tools may offer. Our

ongoing assessment will be crucial in uncovering their capabilities and understanding how they can best serve our objectives in this rapidly evolving digital landscape.

Proposal

Incorporating an OSINT product into our processes and procedures would allow us to **deliver more timely and comprehensive intelligence**, including relevant information on entities of interest and associations, identification of patterns and trends, and insights into emerging threats and vulnerabilities. The potential benefits of OSINT tools are significant and promising.

By embracing OSINT tools, we can anticipate significant efficiency dividends and an opportunity to significantly enhance our influence on future TGA regulatory functions. The potential benefits of OSINT tools are essential and transformative, promising a more effective and **proactive** regulatory approach.

- The intelligence team currently has a relatively small footprint (6 ASL + grad).
- Each OSINT tool will cost between \$130,000 and \$250,000 pa. **Note:** the final costs will not be available until we engage with the vendor
- The cost of one tool is equivalent to a full-time EL1, but it will provide far more benefit than an additional ASL.
- The original vapping NPP included funding for tools; however, it appears that RCB did not receive this funding. It is our understanding that VIEB has an underspend for 2024-25. The OSINT tools would be a beneficial use of these funds.

Option 1 - Purchase both tools

Although the tools share some similarities, they have enough differences to warrant **obtaining licenses for both**. After the initial license period, the Intelligence team could further assess the continuing need for both tools.

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Option 2 - Purchase one tool

Although both tools can address important capability gaps, **NexusXplore** aligns best with the team's current needs.

Digital Services Prioritisation Board Assessment

If we are to progress to the procurement process, the newly established Digital Services Prioritisation Board (DSPB) must assess and endorse the 'plan on a page' document. The DSPB has been put in place to improve the Governance of departmental digital investment decisions, driving:

- Greater user adoption of sustainable digital solutions.
- Improved collaboration with customers and cross-functional teams.

Recommendation:

That you:

- Agree and provide **in-principle-approval** to proceed with **Option 1** purchase licences for both NexusXplore and FIVECAST Onyx.
- If you agree in principle, the next step is for the DSPB to consider it. A draft 'plan on a page' is will be drafted in accordance with approved option.

FYI – RCB can only afford half of one tool – if you are in agreement to purchase both tools – I'm hoping there's so NPP funding still available we can attribute some money towards?

Hi Digital Services Prioritisation Team,

Thank you for providing the additional information from HPRG on the request. I can see from that further detail, that Chris Bedford (FAS) has reviewed and approved the request as a priority for HPRG. I've still followed up with the HPRG Digital Branch Business Support team who look after HPRG Backlog and prioritisation and they confirmed that it's a known item that they are aware of and are supportive of progressing.

Digital Services contacts have reviewed the request and advised:

- Initial engagement was made in regard to POCs for this initiative back in August 2024. If this is now progressing to procurement and implementation, further additional Cyber assessments are required, on how the products fit into the environment. As an Online too, this should be able to be assessed at pace and an Authority to Proceed provided. The Cyber contact is S47F for preliminary evaluation. We should request as part of the Digital Services response that HPRG reaches out to Cyber as part of the procurement process to allow this Cyber assessment.

Initial findings from Cyber Security Architecture:

- Reviewed and support the HPRG Intelligence procurement
- No OSINT platforms used by Cyber- so no cyber tech capability duplication concern.
- Security platform blueprint includes cyber forensic and threat intelligence capabilities but does NOT include Fraud and Intelligence target state capabilities.
 - Enterprise Architecture to review and advise platform blueprint coverage of Fraud and Intelligence capabilities (Open-Source Intelligence platforms)
- Fivecast Onyx and NexusXplore+ are dominant OSINT platforms
 - Fivecast Onyx has broad FedGov adoption S47E(d)
 - NexusXplore+ implemented in S47E(d)
- The procurement, commercials, and software management teams have looked at this and have not identified in our scope, that this already exists, so this would be a new procurement. The IT procurement team should remain engaged on this request. Would be good to know how the software is licenced and what opportunities for reuse outside of HPRG there would be.
- From a Data perspective it would need to be confirmed whether data from this software will be stored, and if so where? E.g. It could be combined into the EDAP instance. The contacts for this would be the DAPS branch through their Engage with DAPS process and S47F.
- No impact or support would be required from Health Business Systems on this request.

@CHESHER, Amanda - Do you have any architectural considerations that need to be added to the above.

Based on the above, unless Architecture has further concerns, and the contacts above engaged then I'd suggest they could proceed.

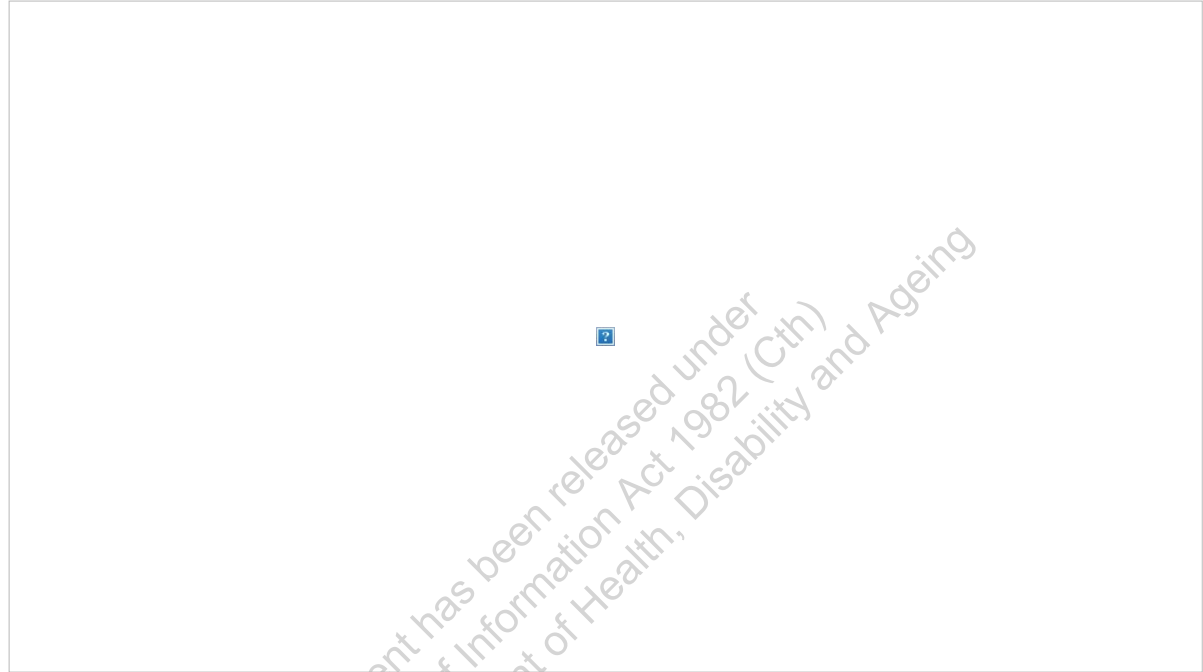
