Lived Experience: The Lived Experience Advisory Board met on 12-13 June in Melbourne PwC Southbank office. There were 17 members present at the meeting, which was facilitated by s 47F from ThinkPlace and supported throughout the day by s 47F (from InnoWell providing secretarial support). The agenda for June 13 LEAB meeting focused on reviewing the past 12 months (supported by s 47F) and identifying the lessons learnt, planning for the next 12 months s 47F 47 development of national community consultation framework (supported by s 47F - see below) and product workshop (supported by s 47F) plus individual product sessions with each LEAB to gather direct feedback on current functionality. In the product workshop, s 47F about the team's desire to find the right balance in the product between usability and configurability, which will allow the product to scale as we grow s 47F talked about the importance of security and privacy for the platform and that the voice of Lived Experience has played a large part in this. s 47F engaged the group with discussions around the feedback that has been coming from the Lived Experience Advisory Board and the Core Design Group and how this is shaping current iterations of the design. s 47F a brief overview of the "Individual User Onboarding: Findings and Recommendations Report".

Community Consultation: During the LEAB 13 June meeting National Community Consultation workshop s 47F , with the assistance of s 47F reintroduced the idea of the four voices of co-design model (originally discussed in the March meeting) and how these voices or perspectives must work together to shape the Community Consultation. s 47F addressed the Board with a potential opportunity to engage the community at the upcoming IMPact Forum to be held on 30 August. A facilitated discussion followed which explored the board's advice on how we might be able to engage with the community at such an event and utilise the draft co-design model in a community consultation framework. Following the meeting, ThinkPlace conducted a series of mini-workshops within InnoWell to discuss the national community consultation co-design model and framework. Both LEAB members and InnoWell have received a further iteration of the model and framework and feedback is due mid July.
