

# Report on significant interactions between Health and the tobacco industry

November 2019	Application to amend the Poisons Standard	Phillip Morris Limited	Health received an application on 1 November 2019 from Phillip Morris Limited to amend the Poisons Standard, to exempt heated tobacco products from Schedule 7. Public consultation on this proposal was open from 20 December 2019 to 10 February 2020. The Joint Meeting of the Advisory Committee of Medicines and Chemicals Scheduling (ACMS/ACCS) considered the proposal on 11 March 2020. The interim decision is anticipated to be published in June 2020, which will be open to further public consultation. The final decision is expected to be published in August 2020.  Phillip Morris Limited also requested an opportunity to present at the ACMS/ACCS March 2020 meeting. This request was not granted.
