- The CMO is accompanying Minister Hunt to Darwin to provide reassurance to the NT Government and local community that the arrangement to repatriate Australians from Wuhan to the Howard Springs Accommodation Facility does not poses risks to the health of the Howard Springs community.
- The Facility will house the repatriated Australians with medical support from AUSMAT personnel. It is currently being outfitted and will be ready for occupation by 0745 Saturday 2020.
- The third plane is estimated to arrive in Darwin at approximately 0745 Saturday 8 February 2020.
