



COVID-19 outbreaks in Australian residential aged care facilities

Analysis

Current situation in Australia

In Australia, a total of 27,362 cases of COVID-19 have been reported, including 250 active cases and 904 deaths.

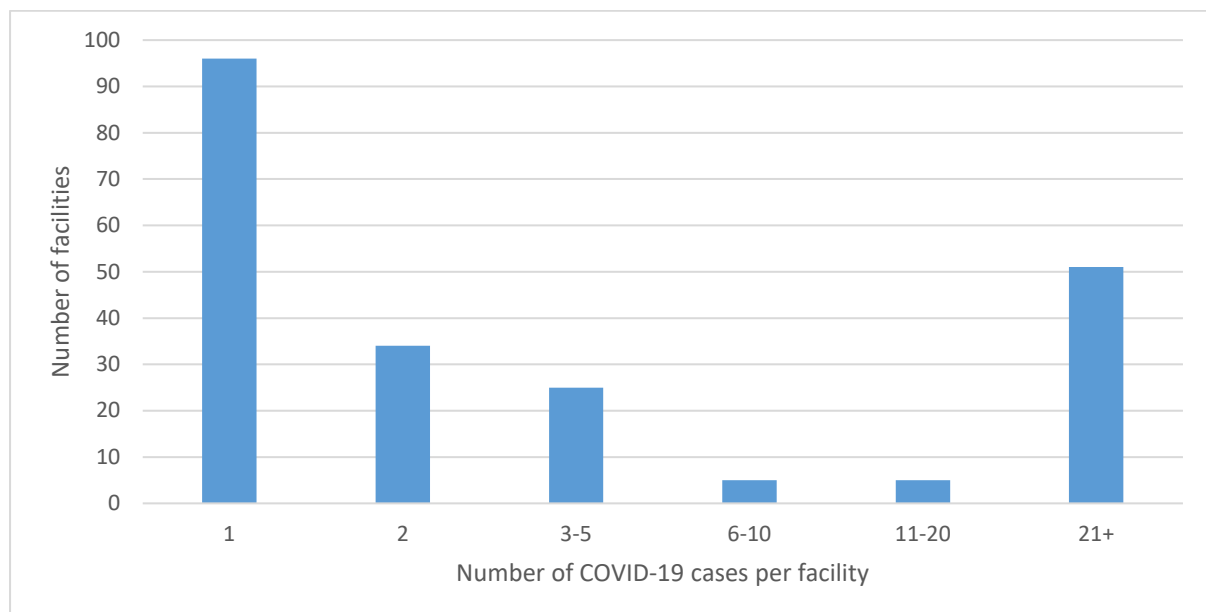
- Of these, a total of 20,315 cases of COVID-19 have been reported in Victoria, including 175 active cases and 816 deaths.

There are 22 residential aged care facilities currently with active COVID-19 cases. All facilities are in Victoria.

Of the 22 residential aged care facilities with active COVID-19 outbreaks, 19 facilities have one or no active cases. The outbreaks at facilities with no active cases remain classified as 'active' for a period of enhanced surveillance, which typically lasts for around 14 days. The classification of an outbreak is changed to 'resolved' at the discretion of the Public Health Unit.

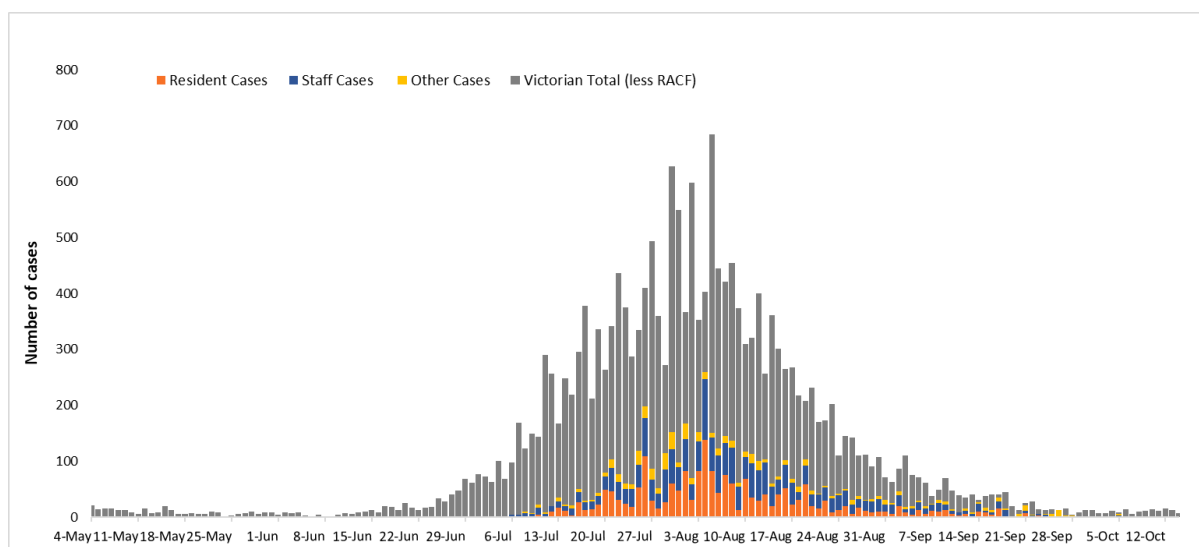
There has been no new active aged care resident cases since 26 September 2020.

Of the 216 residential aged care facilities that have had a case(s) of COVID-19, 96 facilities (45 per cent) have had a single case of COVID-19.

Noting that 'other' refers to individuals associated with an outbreak in aged care who are neither residents nor staff. This category is not reported on in this report.

National comparison of 2020 residential aged care deaths with previous year and influenza comparisons

Across the 2020 calendar year to 31 July, the total number of people who have passed away in residential aged care is 32,398. The lower number of deaths in 2020 in the data available to date (32,398) compared to the same point in 2019 (33,383) is likely the result of increased influenza immunisation rates, and increased infection control protocols introduced during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Sadly influenza kills many elderly Australians each year many of whom live in aged care facilities.

Influenza is an important issue in residential care. Residents, particularly the elderly, are often vulnerable to influenza due to co-morbidities and/or advanced age, and the environment of communal living facilitates the spread of respiratory agents³.

Notification data for influenza by accommodation setting is not reported to the National Notifiable Disease Surveillance System (NNDSS).

The following data represents persons aged 65 and over for all accommodation settings. In the period 1 January to 14 October for each year^{4,5}

- The 2017 influenza season recorded the highest levels of influenza activity since 2009 swine flu pandemic with over 1,035 older Australians dying from influenza.
- In 2018, 76 older Australians died from influenza.
- In 2019, 823 older Australians died from influenza.
- In 2020, 28 older Australians have died from influenza.

International comparisons

During the COVID-19 pandemic, no country has been able to avoid outbreaks or deaths in residential aged care when there has been widespread community transmission.

The Australian death rate is 0.37 per cent (3.7 in 1,000) against the total number of residential aged care beds across the country, and predominantly limited to recent tragic events in Victoria.

As at 15 October 2020, Canada has experienced 9,679 deaths from COVID-19, with 7,266 (or 75 per cent) of these in care homes.

⁴ The data provided were extracted from the NNDSS on 15 October 2020. Due to the dynamic nature of the NNDSS, data in this extract is subject to retrospective revision and may vary from data reported in published NNDSS reports and reports of notification data by states and territories.

⁵ The number of influenza-associated deaths reported to the NNDSS does not represent the true mortality associated with this disease. Reporting of an outcome of infection is not a requirement of notification and comparisons may not be reliable due to difference in methodologies between jurisdictions over time.

Workforce in active residential aged care outbreaks

As part of the aged care response, significant surge workforce assistance has been provided including by both State and National Aged Care Emergency Response (NACER) teams, with many workers deployed from interstate. The number of Commonwealth funded surge staff that have been deployed to Victorian aged care services exceeds 1,000.

Provision of personal protective equipment (PPE)

A range of resources and online training on the use of PPE is available on the Department's website for aged care workers.

Since March 2020, the Commonwealth Government has been working with state and territory governments to ensure aged care facilities have sufficient PPE. PPE is dispatched both directly from the National Medical Stockpile (NMS) and by jurisdictions on the NMS' behalf, depending on the specific circumstances.

Over half a billion masks and approximately 53 million gowns, 261 million gloves, and 44 million goggles/face shields have been ordered for staggered delivery into the NMS through to January 2021.

As at 16 October 2020, the NMS has provided aged care facilities with approximately:

- 18 million masks
- 5 million gowns
- 11 million gloves
- 4 million goggles and face shields
- 90,000 bottles of hand sanitiser
- 160,000 clinical waste bags.

As announced by the Minister for Health and the Minister for Aged Care and Senior Australians on the 30 September 2020, an additional seven million P2/N95 respirators from the National Medical Stockpile have been made available to residential aged care facilities in Melbourne and the Mitchell Shire to further suppress COVID-19 infection rates.

Testing of aged care residents and staff

The Australian Government has engaged Sonic Healthcare to provide a dedicated pathology service for the testing of suspected cases of COVID-19 in residential aged care facilities. The service is intended to supplement existing public health pathology services in aged care through the provision of services from the private sector as required.

As at 6 October, Sonic Healthcare has conducted 182,928 COVID-19 tests at 2,006 unique residential aged care facilities nationally. This includes 161,474 COVID-19 tests at 561 unique residential aged care facilities in Victoria.

Testing regimens for residents and staff at aged care facilities that experience a COVID-19 outbreak is based on advice from the relevant Public Health Unit.

To help the sector to drive down case numbers, the Australian Government has expanded capacity for testing of asymptomatic aged care workers in Victoria. Services in hot spot locations are being prioritised.

Infection control and audits

The Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (Commission) commenced additional Infection Control Monitoring visits in Victoria from 3 August 2020 in response to the increasing risk of COVID-19 outbreaks in residential aged care services, following significant community transmission of COVID-19 in Victoria.

The purpose of the visit is to observe infection control practices, to ensure that staff, management and visitors are adhering to safe personal protective equipment protocols and to safe infection control arrangements as required under the quality standards.

The Commission has extended the infection control monitoring program rolled out in Victoria, into other jurisdictions, working in partnership with local health authorities. This program is in addition to the Commission's usual assessment and auditing program, and includes spot checks to residential aged care services, without an outbreak, to check compliance with PPE and infection control arrangements. This program in Victoria has been complemented by compliance checks to 593 residential aged care facilities by Australian Defence Force (ADF) personnel, and 37 facilities by Western Health personnel.

From 1 March 2020, the Commission has undertaken 1,279 visits nationally relating to infection control, including spot checks and 1,722 unannounced visits and announced/short notice visits.

All residential aged care facilities will be required to engage an onsite clinical lead to provide leadership and increase capacity in relation to infection prevention and control. The Australian Government is providing a second payment of the COVID-19 supplement to assist facilities in meeting the additional costs of preparing for and responding to COVID-19.

Under the Commonwealth-State Plan to boost preparedness, states and territories are complementing the activity being undertaken by the Commission through additional site visits by state health services at the local level. These visits are strengthening state health service relationships with local aged care services as part of the standing up of joint health aged care emergency response centres in each jurisdiction.
