1. Proposed Variation on the Stoma Appliance Scheme

The applicant, Omnigon, sought the addition of one variant to the current listing of the Omnigon Welland Aurum (SAS Code 80092J) in subgroup 1(a), of the Stoma Appliance Scheme (the Scheme) Schedule. The product, is currently listed at a unit price of \$1.373, with a maximum monthly quantity of 60 units.

2. Variants to be added

The applicant requested the following variants be added to the existing listing for SAS Code 80092J.

XMHSS535	Opaque with fabric cover on both sides, cap, 1.3mm,

	standard wear, oval, pre-cut, 35mm.

3. Background

This product was first listed on the SAS Schedule in April 2016.

4. Clinical Place for the Product

The proposed product provides an alternative for users requiring a one-piece closed pouch with stoma cap.

Financial Analysis

Listing of one variant is recommended on a cost-minimisation basis compared to products currently listed in subgroup 1(a) of the SAS Schedule. It is therefore unlikely that there would be any budgetary impact for the SAS as a consequence of listing three variants to the current product range.

5. SPAP Recommendation

The Panel recommended the addition of one variant to the current product range for Omnigon Welland Aurum (SAS Code 80092J) listed in subgroup 1(a), of the SAS Schedule at the unit price of \$1.373, with a maximum monthly quantity of 60 units.

6. Context for Decision

The Panel helps decide whether stoma products should be subsidised and, if so, the conditions of their subsidisation in Australia. It considers submissions in this context. A Panel decision not to recommend listing or changes to a listing does not represent a final Panel view about the merits of a particular stoma product. A company can resubmit to the Panel following a decision not to recommend listing or changes to a listing. The Panel is an advisory committee and as such its recommendations are non-binding on Government. All Panel recommendations are subject to Cabinet/Ministerial approval.

7. Applicant's Comment

Omnigon agrees with the Panel's recommendation.
