Dear Shitij and Helen,

We have received 13 votes in the poll – two members didn't vote – and the consensus is that the preferred approach is to allocate the '\$5 million plus one' to each priority area, then allocate the remainder based upon peer review rank.

Below is a draft email for your use to communicate this result to panel members. We would also like to take this opportunity to advise members that the 11 April 2019 meeting will be cancelled, and that the next meeting of the panel will be in June where we will Workshop future priorities/grant opportunities.

Dear members,

Thank you for voting in the poll to decide our approach for making recommendations and managing conflicts of interest in finalising the first Million Minds Mission grant round. We have received the final results, and the preferred approach is to allocate the

'\$5 million plus one' to each priority area, then allocate the remainder based upon peer review rank. Following tomorrow's NHMRC peer review panel meeting, this approach will be used to make recommendations to the Minister.

In light of these changes, the Department advises me that the 11 April 2019 meeting has been cancelled, that it is proposed that the panel will next meet again in June for a future focused workshop, and that the Department will be in touch shortly to identify a suitable date.
