Thank you also from me for this advice. It is great to see funding flowing into the mental health research community, and there are so many worthy recipients and projects in the mix.

It is really important, I feel, that we have a meeting in the next month or so – separate to the June workshop (which I understand will involve the wider sector) – to debrief about the process for this first grant round, lessons learned, plans for future rounds. Also, now that the grant round is over, I think it is important for us to understand more details about how applications were ranked, who was on the assessment panel, how did they interpret and understand the purpose of the Mission and funding call...those sorts of things. Might the Chair of the panel be able to attend and report on this process (including what could be improved for future rounds of funding)? Do others on our Advisory Panel support this and would you make yourselves available for a meeting of our Advisory Panel for these issues?

I'm assuming that the additional funding (which I support, of course!) is not additional funding from the Minister's office, but will come out of the Million Minds Mission allocation for the next financial year, so we have less money to distribute going forward? Or did the Minister find some extra \$\$ for us??! I'd also ask the Department to consider appointing a Chair for the June workshop from within the mental health sector please (assuming we are persisting with the idea of a sector-wide workshop rather than taking on board the results of similar sector-wide workshops for mental health research that are happening at NHMRC and the National Mental Health Commission at the moment). Having someone familiar with our type and scope of research – as opposed to someone from other medical fields – will be so important to facilitate and summarise the discussions that will come up during this session. It is with great pleasure that I advise that the Minister for Health, the Hon. Greg Hunt MP approved the outcomes of the first Million Minds Mental Health Research Mission grants round. In total, seven projects have been approved for funding: two child and youth (approx. \$10 million), two eating disorders (approx. \$5 million), and three Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander mental health projects (approx. \$12.45 million). You will note that the Minister has exercised his discretion to approve an additional \$2.45 million to ensure that the application that straddled the cusp of the funding cut off could be funded in its entirety. The list of successful applications is below. Please note that this information is currently under embargo and forwarded to you as **committee in confidence** and cannot be passed on until this embargo is lifted. We will advise by way of email when this embargo has been lifted.

We anticipate that the Minister will be making announcements covering these grants in the coming days.
