



COVID-19 outbreaks in Australian residential aged care facilities

National snapshot

As at 8:00am on 13 August 2021 there are 83 active cases of COVID-19 related to aged care across seventeen (17) residential aged care facilities.

Analysis

Current situation in Australia

As at 12:00 hrs 12 August 2021 there has been a total of 37,754 cases of COVID-19 reported, including 5879⁴ active cases and 947 deaths in Australia.

As at 8:00 am 13 August 2021 there are:

- 24 active resident cases, nine (9) active staff cases and two resident deaths associated with COVID-19 in Wyoming Nursing Home, NSW;
- one (1) active resident cases and one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Yallambee Village, NSW;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Mary Andrews Retirement Hostel, NSW;
- one (1) active resident case and one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Bupa Clenton Park, NSW;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in St Hedwig's Village Blacktown, NSW;
- two (2) active resident cases and one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Greenwood Aged Care Normanhurst, NSW;
- two (2) active staff case of COVID-19 in Stanmore Place Care Community, NSW;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Archbold House, Roseville;
- two (2) active resident cases and two (2) active staff cases of COVID-19 in Anglican Care Jesmond Grove, Jesmond;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in HammondCare Waratah;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Hawkesbury Living Nursing Home;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in IRT Thomas Holt, Kirrawee;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in Pemulwuy Aged Care;
- 13 active resident cases, three (3) active staff cases, and one resident death associated with COVID-19 in RFBI Hawkins Masonic Village, Edgeworth;
- Seven (7) active resident cases and two (2) active staff cases of COVID-19 in St George Aged Care Centre, Bexley;
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in SummitCare St Mary's; and
- one (1) active staff case of COVID-19 in St Mary's Villa.

In NSW, all residential age care facilities are being monitored through the NSW Aged Care State Health Emergency Operations Centre. A Commonwealth Health Departmental officer is embedded with the NSW State Health Emergency Operations Centre, with additional supports activated as the need arises. The Commonwealth is supporting both facilities with workforce surge deployments, including a Clinical First Responder.

On 29 July 2021, the Australian Government (Government) Chief Medical Officer has extended the Hotspot for the purposes of Commonwealth support for all LGAs in Greater Sydney, including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Shellharbour and Wollongong until 11:59pm on 28 August 2021, with further review on or before 28 August 2021.

Declaring a hotspot for Commonwealth support triggers additional supports, such as the Support for Aged Care Workers in COVID-19 (SACWIC) grant to support providers to implement single site working arrangements in specified locations within the hotspot area and in areas in close proximity to the hotspot area. These arrangements have been extended and will remain in place until 11 September 2021.

The Commonwealth Chief Medical Officer has widened the Greater Sydney COVID-19 Hotspot for the purposes of Commonwealth support to include an additional eight LGAs of the City of Cessnock, City of Lake Macquarie, Dungog Shire, Maitland, Muswellbrook Shire, Newcastle, Port Stephens Council, and Singleton Council from 11:59pm 5 August 2021 to 11:59pm 12 August 2021. Single site workforce arrangements and the SACWIC grant have been activated in these areas from 5 August to 11 September.

The Acting Australian Government Chief Medical Officer, Professor Michael Kidd, lifted the COVID-19 hotspot declaration for all locations in Victoria from 11:59pm on 27 July 2021. On 5 August 2021, a new hotspot was declared for Greater Melbourne, Moorabool Shire, City of Greater Geelong, and Golden Plains Shire. Single site workforce arrangements and the SACWIC Grant has been activated in these areas from 16 July. These have been extended in Greater Melbourne and surrounds and will remain in place until 27 August 2021.

On 8 August, the Australian Government Chief Medical Officer, Professor Paul Kelly, has de-listed the hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support for the City of Brisbane, Moreton Bay Region, Redland City, Logan City, City of Ipswich, Shire of Noosa, City of Gold Coast, Lockyer Valley Region, Scenic Rim Region, Somerset Region and Sunshine Coast Region Local Government Areas (LGAs). This is consistent with the Queensland Government's announcement today to lift the lockdown restrictions in South East Queensland.

Professor Paul Kelly has declared the Bathurst Regional Council, Bogan Shire, Bourke Shire, Brewarrina Shire, Coonamble Shire, Gilgandra Shire, Narromine Shire, Walgett Shire and Warren Shire Local Government Areas (LGAs) as a Hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support from 11:59pm on 11 August 2021, for an initial period of seven days until 11:59pm on 18 August 2021, with review on or before this date.

Professor Kelly declared on 12 August that the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) a Hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support from 11:59pm on 12 August 2021, for an initial period of 7 days until 11:59pm on 19 August 2021, with review on or before this date. This is in-line with the ACT Government's announcement today.

Professor Kelly on the 11 of August 2021 declared the City of Dubbo as a Hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support from 11:59pm 11 August 2021 until 11:59pm 18 August 2021 with review on or before this date.

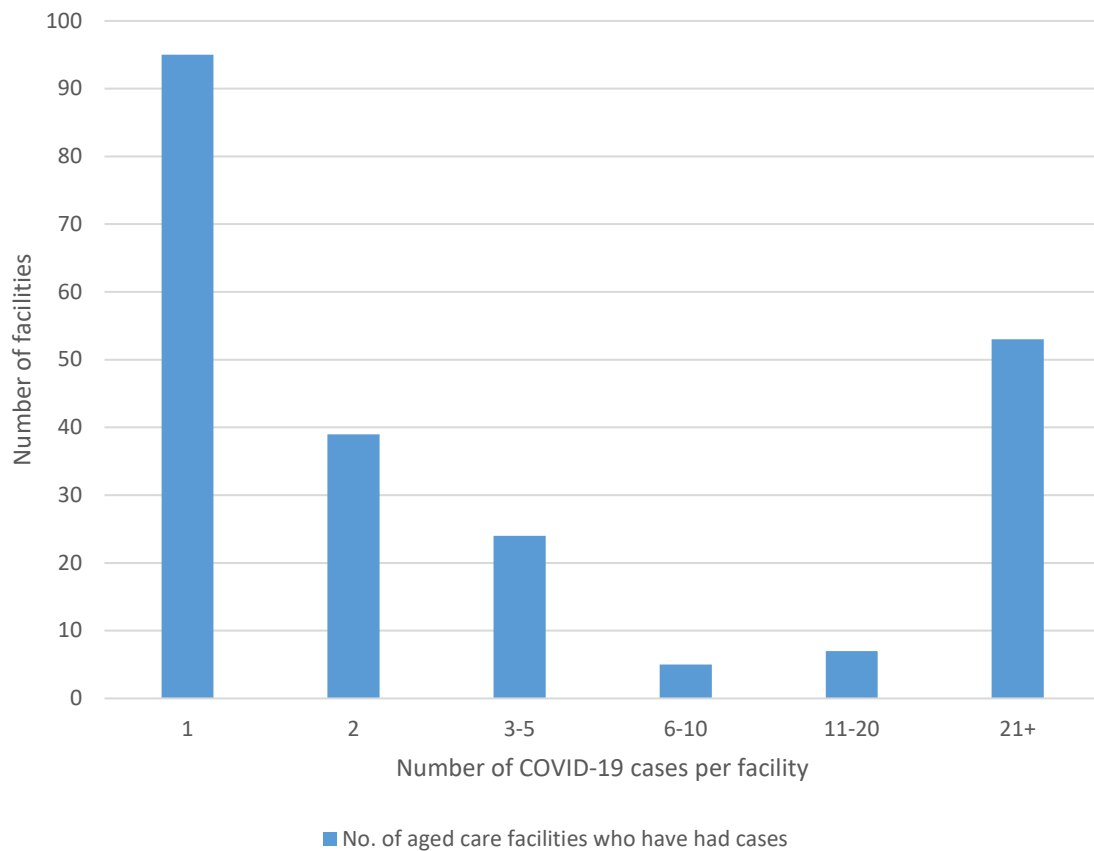
Professor Kelly on 11 August 2021 extended the Greater Melbourne, City of Greater Geelong, Moorabool, and Golden Plains Hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support for a further seven days until 11:59pm 19 August 2021.

Professor Paul Kelly on 9 August 2021 declared the Armidale Regional LGA as a hotspot for the purpose of Commonwealth support from 11:59 pm on 9 August 2021, for an initial period of 5 days until 11:59 pm on 14 August 2021, with review on or before this date.

Professor Kelly on 9 August 2021 declared the Regional Councils of Tamworth, Byron Shire, Richmond Valley, Ballina Shire and Lismore LGAs as a hotspots for the purpose of Commonwealth support from 11:59 pm on 9 August 2021 for an initial period of seven days until 11:59 pm 16 August 2021, with review on or before this date.

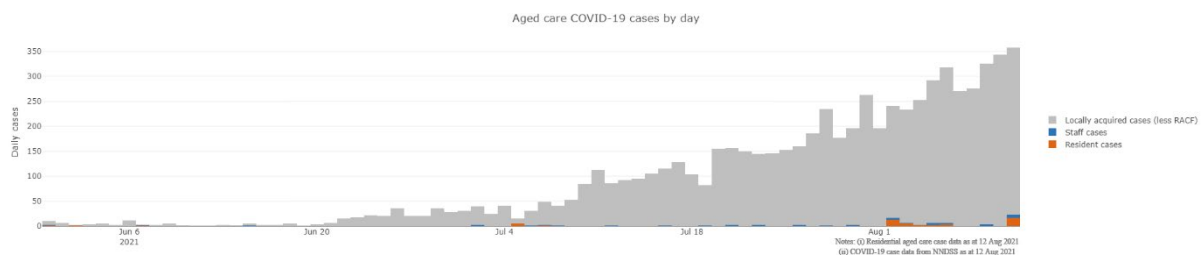
Single site workforce arrangements and the SACWIC grant has been activated in all hotspot areas.

Of the 242 residential aged care facilities that have had a case(s) of COVID-19, 116 facilities (48 per cent) have had a single case of COVID-19. As at 6 August 2021, 90.6 per cent of all residential aged care facilities have had no cases of COVID-19 in residents or staff.

International comparisons

During the COVID-19 pandemic, no country has been able to avoid outbreaks or deaths in residential aged care when there has been widespread community transmission.

The Australian death rate is 0.37 per cent (3.7 in 1,000) against the total number of residential aged care beds across the country.

By comparison, Canada has experienced more than 22 times the number of deaths in care homes than Australia as at 12 August 2021.

- As at 9 August 2021, Canada had experienced 26,607 deaths – 15,210 (or 57 per cent) in care homes.
- 47 per cent of all aged care homes in Canada have had reported cases of COVID-19 in residents or staff (compared to 9.4 per cent in Australia).

Workforce in active residential aged care outbreaks

As part of the aged care response, significant surge workforce assistance has been provided including by both State and National Aged Care Emergency Response (NACER) teams, with many workers deployed from interstate.

Provision of personal protective equipment (PPE)

A range of resources and online training on the use of PPE is available on the Department's website for aged care workers.

Since March 2020, the Commonwealth Government has been working with state and territory governments to ensure aged care facilities have sufficient PPE. PPE is dispatched both directly from the National Medical Stockpile (NMS) and by jurisdictions on the NMS' behalf, depending on the specific circumstances.

As at 9 August 2021, the NMS has provided aged care facilities with approximately:

- 21 million masks
- 5 million gowns
- 13 million gloves
- 5 million goggles and face shields
- 80,000 bottles of hand sanitiser

The NMS remains well positioned to respond rapidly to critical shortages of PPE and other medical supplies anywhere in Australia. This includes a series of bulk dispatches of personal protective equipment (PPE) intended to avert any potential critical supply shortages, as well as urgent deployments to organisations and individuals at risk of exposure to COVID-19.

Testing of aged care residents and staff

The Australian Government has engaged Sonic Healthcare to provide a dedicated pathology service for the testing of suspected cases of COVID-19 in residential aged care facilities. The service is intended to supplement existing public health pathology services in aged care through the provision of services from the private sector as required. Testing regimens for residents and staff at aged care facilities that experience a COVID-19 outbreak is based on advice from the relevant Public Health Unit.

As at 10 August 2021, under contract with the Commonwealth, Sonic Healthcare has conducted 475,170 COVID-19 tests at 2,544 unique residential aged care facilities (RACFs) nationally.

Vaccination in Residential Aged Care Facilities

All first and second dose COVID-19 vaccination clinics across residential aged care facilities in the Commonwealth's aged care rollout are now completed. As at 13 August 2021, 319,054 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered to people in 2,569 residential aged care facilities across Australia.

All 883 facilities across NSW have received both a dose 1 and dose 2 Commonwealth in reach vaccination clinic.

The Commonwealth is actioning roving clinics in 23 LGA's within Sydney effected areas. There are 302 facilities receiving clinics, which offer vaccine to any residents and staff yet to receive a vaccine.

As at 11 August, 251 facilities have received a 3rd dose clinic and 233 a 4th dose clinic.

Infection control and audits

The Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (Commission) conducted an infection control monitoring (ICM) program in all Australian jurisdictions, working in partnership with local health authorities. This program was in addition to the Commission's usual assessment and auditing program, and included spot checks to residential aged care services, without an outbreak, to check compliance with PPE and infection control arrangements.

The purpose of the visit was to observe infection control practices, to ensure that staff, management and visitors were adhering to safe personal protective equipment protocols and to safe infection control arrangements as required under the quality standards.

As at 10 August 2021, the Commission has undertaken 2,817 spot checks to observe infection control practices and PPE protocols in residential aged care facilities. The Commission is transitioning to a COVID-normal regulatory response and has ICM Spot Check Visit program. ICM spot check visits will no longer be undertaken as separate activities and will instead be undertaken within the Commission’s usual regulatory operations.

All residential aged care facilities are required to engage an onsite clinical lead to provide leadership and increase capacity in relation to infection prevention and control. The Australian Government is providing a second payment of the COVID-19 supplement to assist facilities in meeting the additional costs of preparing for and responding to COVID-19.

In addition, under the Commonwealth-State Plan to boost aged care preparedness, states and territories are complementing the activity being undertaken by the Commission through additional site visits by state health services at the local level, which includes work relating to infection prevention and control (see Table 3 below). These visits are strengthening state health service relationships with local aged care services as part of the standing up of joint health aged care emergency response centres in each jurisdiction.

The Australian Government is working collaboratively with the states and territories to further bolster infection prevention and control through high quality face-to-face training in the aged care sector. In particular, the Government has committed \$57.8 million to fund states and territories to deliver additional targeted infection prevention and control (IPC) training to enhance RACF staff IPC skills; and undertake prevention, preparedness and response activities to address a COVID-19 outbreak in RACFs, including supporting RACFs to uplift IPC capacity by providing IPC training.
