

New Zealand – Situation Update 22 September 2021

Information presented in this assessment is based on New Zealand's publicly available information provided on the New Zealand Ministry of Health website.¹

Current Assessment Summary

- New Zealand has officially recorded a total of 1,108 locally acquired cases in the current outbreak at the time of this report.
- Currently, all New Zealand except for Auckland is at Alert Level 2.
- On 21 September 2021, Auckland moved to Alert Level 3 with the Government of New Zealand to review Alert Levels for all regions on Monday 4 October 2021.
- On 20 September 2021, due to detection of cases associated with approved travel of a person from Auckland, temporary Alert Level 4 restrictions were applied to the Upper Hauraki region.
- As widespread testing did not detect any cases beyond the immediate household, the area moved to Alert Level 3 on 22 September 2021.

Outbreak Summary

- The current outbreak commenced on 17 August 2021.
- Of the 1,108 cases reported in the current outbreak, 28 cases are not yet epidemiologically linked.
- There are currently 13 hospitalisations, with two in ICU.
- Of the locally acquired cases, 1,091 are in Auckland and 17 (all now recovered) of these cases were in Wellington.
- At 1200 hrs NZT 22 September 2021, there are 129 locations of interest events tabled that have been reported across the North Island, all of which are in the greater Auckland region.
- As at 1300 hrs NZT 22 September 2021, 1,282 active contacts are being managed.
 - 93 per cent of these people have been contacted, and 89 per cent have returned at least one test result.
- There have been no unexpected detections of COVID-19 in wastewater testing.

Travel impacts

- On 21 September 2021, the Australian Chief Medical Officer announced that the Australian Government would continue the pause of green zone flights from New Zealand to Australia until 11:59pm (AEST) on 5 October 2021. Until this time, all flights originating in New Zealand will be classified as Red Zone flights. The pause will be reviewed on 5 October 2021.
- Quarantine-free travel from all Australian states and territories to New Zealand was suspended from 23 July 2021 due to the worsening COVID-19 situation in Australia. This suspension was extended by the New Zealand Government for at least a further eight weeks on 17 September 2021 and is scheduled to be reviewed in late November 2021.
