Supporting access to boosters

The NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission strongly encourages NDIS providers to take all necessary steps to assist participants to access COVID-19 vaccination where they need assistance to do so, including boosters. Refer to the provider alert issued by the NDIS Commission on 7 December 2021 for more information.

Booster doses and in-reach service

People with disability who have completed their primary course of a COVID-19 vaccine at least **four months ago** are eligible for a booster dose. Booster doses are available through Commonwealth vaccination providers, either through in-reach or a dedicated disability hub. They are also available through other channels such as a GP, pharmacy, or state or territory vaccination clinic.

Disability service providers for disability residential accommodation settings will be contacted by a Commonwealth vaccination provider to organise in-reach for booster doses. Commonwealth vaccination providers are currently working through their allocations, based on indicative booster dose due dates.

Other ways to get a booster vaccine

When you or a person you support becomes eligible to receive a booster vaccine, you can access a booster through any of these ways:

- Use the COVID-19 Clinic Finder. The Clinic Finder also has information about:
 - o getting help from a translator
 - o booking for someone else
 - o disability vaccination clinics.
- Talk to a doctor (GP)
- Visit a pharmacy that is administering COVID-19 vaccines.

TGA approves Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for 5 to 11-year-olds

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) has approved the Comirnaty (Pfizer) vaccine as safe and effective for use among children aged 5 to 11 years old. The Australian Government has started rolling out the Pfizer vaccine to 5 to 11-year-olds from 10 January 2022.

ATAGI statement on Omicron variant and timing of COVID-19 booster doses

On Friday 24th of December 2021, ATAGI provided a statement about the Omicron variant in relation to the timing of booster dose administration.

Given the likelihood of ongoing transmission of both Omicron and Delta variants, ATAGI recommends COVID-19 booster vaccination for anyone aged 18 and older who completed their primary course of COVID-19 vaccination 4 or more months ago.

Temporary changes to COVID-19 pricing arrangements

The NDIA has announced changes to meal preparation and delivery, some supported independent living (SIL) supports and deep cleaning temporary COVID-19 measures.

The changes include:

- flexible use of core funding for meal preparation and delivery services has been extended to include participants in all states and territories until 28 February 2022
- SIL providers can directly claim from the NDIA for cleaning services and additional SIL supports when a participant has to isolate (no longer from participant funds)
- providers can directly claim from the NDIA for a one-off deep clean of a participant's house when a support worker is diagnosed with COVID-19.

The NDIA has published an updated COVID Addendum that outlines the dates of these changes.

New practice standards for emergency and disaster management
