



Transition to College-Led Training Advisory Committee

Communique – 19 October 2021

The 12th meeting of the Australian Government Department of Health Transition to College-Led Training Advisory Committee (TCLTAC) was held on 19 October 2021.

The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners provided an update on their Development of Profession-led Community Based Training-Education Program, advising a Discussion Paper will be distributed shortly providing significant detail on how they intend to deliver GP training from 2023.

The Committee also heard updates from the Department on the development of the College Assurance process; progress on the development of the College IT systems to manage the Australian General Practice Training program; and the fourth and final Payments Workshop to establish consistent payment rates for registrars, supervisors and practices under College-led training. The Committee also noted the proposed framework presented at the Payments Workshop was well received, with some additional refinements to be made before finalisation in the near future.

Members noted grant opportunity guidelines setting out the Commonwealth's requirements for College-led GP training models will be released shortly.
