Statement from Australia's Chief Medical Officer, Professor Brendan Murphy, on health and the new generation of mobile phone network 5G

The community should be reassured that 5G technology is safe

There is no evidence that telecommunication technologies, such as 5G, cause adverse health impacts. This position is supported by health authorities around the world, including the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Agency (ARPANSA).

Mobile phone networks and other wireless telecommunications emit low-powered radio waves also known as radiofrequency (RF) electromagnetic energy (EME). This is different to ionising radiation associated with nuclear energy or use in medicine.

The radio waves which the general public is exposed to from telecommunications are not hazardous to human health.

To ensure the public remains protected, the Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Agency (ARPANSA) established limits for EME through a standard. This is designed to protect people from exposure to radio waves and limits are set well below the levels where there is evidence of some biological effects such as tissue heating. All telecommunications, including new 5G technology, has to comply with the exposure limits in the ARPANSA standard, which is enforced by the Australian Communications and Media Authority.

In order to further improve understanding about this issue, the Australian Government omot recently announced that an enhanced EME program will be established.

Under the enhanced program, additional funding will be provided for:

- Targeted research, including research on the use of higher frequencies;
- More environmental measurement studies of EME in the community; and •
- More information for, and engagement with, the public about the safety and regulation of EME.
